INTRODUCTION

1. The Mustang Owners Club of Australia (NSW) Inc. (herein known as 'the Club') is approved by Services NSW to participate in this scheme.
2. These Rules for Members ("the rules") are to be read in conjunction with the Services NSW Rules for Conditional Registration Scheme.
3. Members applying for HVS, or CVS plates should obtain a copy of the rules prior to issue. The member shall read, initial each page, sign and forward one copy of the rules to the Club Plate Registrar, indicating that they fully understand their responsibilities and they agree to abide by the rules of the Club as well as the Conditional Registration Scheme. The member should check the rules each 12 months for any updates.
4. The purpose of conditional registration is to preserve these vehicles as a representation of their time and place in history and to allow members to be able to use these vehicles.
5. These rules may be amended by the Executive Committee (herein known as the Committee) from time to time as required. The Committee is the final arbitrator of these rules.
6. These rules will apply to all vehicle registrations under our ('the Club') conditional registration scheme.

BACKGROUND

7. The RMS will register historic vehicles, which provides the vehicle with limited access to the road network and Compulsory Third Party (CTP) insurance cover. At present, historic vehicles registered under this scheme are exempt from the payment of stamp duty, motor vehicle tax and national charges.
8. On the 1 October 2015 the RMS commenced a two-year trial allowing vehicles on CRS-H registration to drive their vehicles on any 60 days during the year of registration of their vehicle. The trial was successful and is now permanent.
9. MOCA (NSW) was a participating Club for this Trial and have been registered with Services NSW accordingly.

10. The Club is incorporated under the NSW Incorporated Association laws administered by the Department of Fair Trading which affords protection for the Committee of the Club and its members. The Club has Public Liability Insurance cover.

ELIGIBILITY

11. Services NSW requires the member to be a NSW resident.
12. The member must be a financial member of the Club and must remain financial for the registration to be valid.

REQUIREMENTS

13. The vehicle must be at least thirty (30) years old at the time of application for Conditional registration. For HVS the vehicle must be as close to original condition as possible with no alterations except for safety features such as seat belts, period accessories or period improvements.

Conversion to right hand drive is allowed but not required. For vehicles that have been converted, an Engineer's Report may be required by Services NSW.

14. A list of all alterations, accessories or improvements added after production of the vehicle must be provided to the Committee for consideration for eligibility. The Committee may require documented evidence that the accessories or improvements were available within the period. Applicants should be aware of the RMS Vehicle Standards Information Sheet No. 6 - Light Vehicle Modifications. Conditional registration is not to be used to circumvent these requirements.

CVS vehicles are allowed street legal modifications.

15. . The Club's Application for HVS or CVS Form is available from the Club Registrar or download from the Club website. The member will apply to the Club Registrar each year, one month prior to the registration renewal date, send a Historic Vehicle Declaration (herein known as Form 1259) or Classic Vehicle Declaration (herein known as form 1835) to allow for the renewal for the following year. If the vehicle has been altered since the last renewal date, acceptable supporting documentation must be provided to the Committee for consideration for eligibility.
16. Photographs of the vehicle showing front and rear ¾ views as well as engine bay and interior to allow identification, shall be supplied by the member.
17. The member must attend a minimum of three (3) Club endorsed events each year and have their logbook signed by a member of the Committee or their delegate in attendance.
18. The left side of form 1259 or 1835 shall be completed and sent to the Club Plate registrar, to have the bottom right corner signed and stamped by the Club Registrar, form 1835 for CVS

must also have CMC's stamp as well, the 1835 form will be forwarded to the CMC after it has been processed by the 'Club'.

19. The signed and stamped Form 1259 or 1835 with the appropriate road worthiness certificate must be presented to Services NSW by the member within the time frame as required by Services NSW to be valid.

20. The vehicle shall always display conditional registration plates. Name bars may also be affixed providing it does not obscure the number plates.

21. When issued, Services NSW Certificate of Approved Operations (Purple Form) it should be always kept in the vehicle.

VEHICLE ROADWORTHINESS

22. The member is required to obtain a Roadworthy Certificate for the vehicle from a Services NSW approved authorised inspection station. The Club does not issue inspection certificates or do inspections.

CONDITIONS OF VEHICLE USE

23. Unlogged use of vehicles under the conditional registration scheme may result in the vehicle being regarded as an unregistered vehicle by Services NSW which could jeopardise insurance cover or leave the driver liable to incur charges or financial penalty by law enforcement authorities.

24. Vehicles on conditional registration can use their vehicles at their discretion for 60 days in a calendar year, with the year starting when the registration is initiated, then finishing 12 months from that date.

25. Members will need to complete the services NSW logbook entry for each day of usage and one line represents one day but can incorporate multiple trips.

26. Remuneration, other than a petrol allowance, shall not be accepted where the vehicle is used for Weddings, Formals, ETC. Members wishing to use their vehicle for the carriage of persons to or from a Wedding or Formal, ETC, should be aware of their legal obligation under the "Passenger Transport Act 1990" (as amended) with the Taxi & Hire Car Bureau of the Ministry of Transport or other relevant authority.

GENERAL

27. Conditional registration plates are not transferable on disposal of the vehicle. Registration plates shall be returned to Services NSW and the Club Registrar should be immediately notified.
28. NSW rules allow a vehicle to be operated temporarily outside of the State for a limited period as determined by Services NSW. Longer periods require written Services NSW approval. Regardless, members should check Services NSW and with other state or territory registration authorities that a vehicle registered under conditional registration conditions may operate within the other state or territory and the rules that apply to the use of the vehicle whilst in the other state or territory.
29. If a member, who owns a Ford Mustang, also has other vehicles eligible for NSW conditional registration, the Committee may approve having those vehicles recorded under the club's conditional registration scheme. Any such vehicle may need to be inspected by a Club representative to confirm the vehicle presented, does meet these Rules. Additional information may also be sought.
30. Where the member belongs to more than one Services NSW recognised club, the details of the other club(s) may be entered under the Club membership details on Services NSW Form 1259 or 1835. These details are to be provided to the Club Registrar via the Club's Application Form for HVS or CVS registration.
31. The Club Plate Registrar reserves the right to refuse registration or renewal of registration at their discretion if the vehicle is deemed to be ineligible for conditional registration, or the member has failed to comply with any aspect of these rules.
Any member who has had their vehicle declined for conditional Registration or renewal, has the right to appeal the decision of the Club Plate Registrar. Such appeal is to include completion of the **MOCA CRS-H Appeal Form** and is to be submitted with all supporting documentation from the member to the Club President for review by the Committee at their monthly meeting. The decision of the Committee will be binding.

APPLYING FOR CONDITIONAL REGISTRATION

First registration:

- 1) Complete the Application form (mustang.org.au – NSW – Document Centre)
- 2) Read, initial and sign a copy of these Rules,
- 3) Attach a copy of the appropriate roadworthy certificate
- 4) The appropriate Declaration, with the left side completed.
- 5) Send all these documents along with the required photos of car to the Club Plate Registrar (scanned and emailed version is preferred)

Each year thereafter:

Renewing registration:

- 1) Complete the MOCA HVS/CVS Application.
- 2) Forward this with a copy of the Logbook entries for previous 12 months, with at least 3 club events highlighted for easy recognition, to the Club Plate Registrar. (Scanned and emailed is preferred)
- 3) A copy of a current Roadworthy Certificate.
- 4) The appropriate Declaration, with the left side completed.
- 5) Check the rules for any updates in the last 12 months.
