GENERAL BUSINESS:

VOTING: All 3 proposals were passed by a majority of the votes collected. The relevant paperwork will be completed tonight and David Irving will post it to the Department of Fair Trading tomorrow. Many thanks to David for all the work he has put into the paperwork involved. Martin Schmidt asked if there was a certain percentage of the votes needed to pass. David said as long as the majority vote was in favour, that was all we needed to proceed.

CLUBHOUSE: Barry spoke about things that were to be sorted at the clubhouse. On the plus side all the test & tagging has been completed and the fire extinguishers have been replaced. 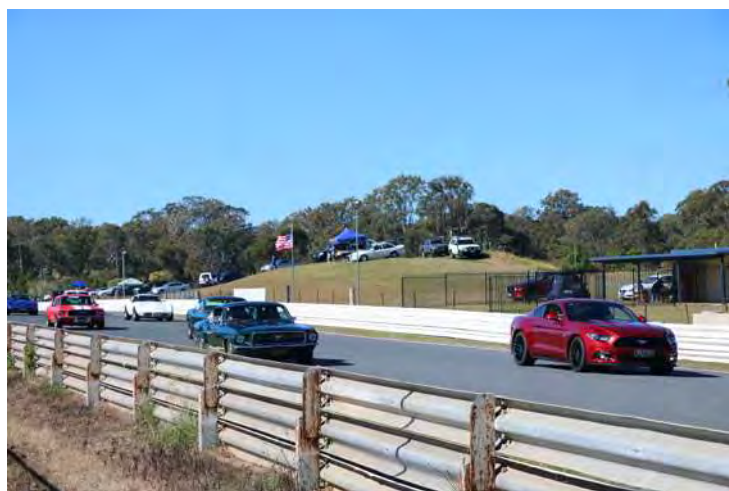

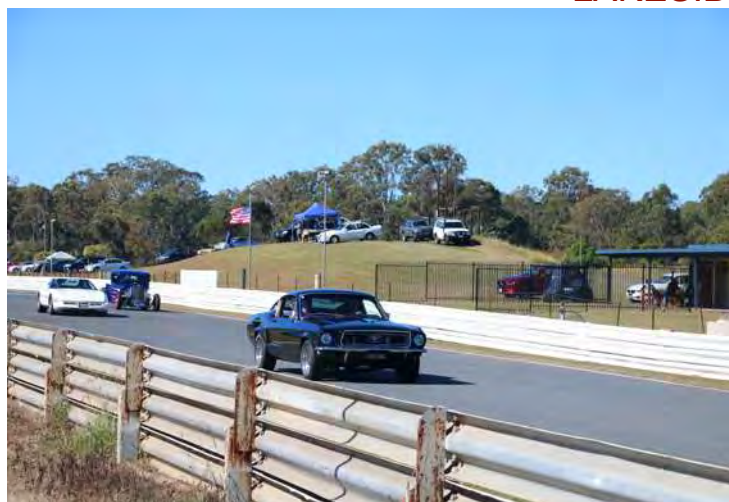

He has put some research into the problems with asbestos in imported vehicles and has put a letter forward he would like to put to the other states through AHMF [which is the federal body linking all states through their groups, similar to QHMC.]

The decision of the meeting was to send a delegation to attend the next annual meeting of AHMF. They are Doug Young, Christen Stephens and Russell Manning. The main message is to educate mechanics in the way to handle asbestos. As you see from the letter when CHERRY and GREATWALL were caught they only had to fit a warning sticker under the bonnet to warn of the existence of asbestos. I have been told Nissan importers may be allowed to perform their own inspection while their cars are in BOND. So at least some one may be interested?

Australian Border Force in looking for asbestos is targeting second hand car imports - not only their brake, clutch and gasket components - but is also requiring destructive testing of many irreplaceable original components, such as wiring looms, headlining, under body sound deadener (sealer), door frame padding, windscreen caulking, windscreen washer bags, and body items like air scoops and ducts. It has also been reported that sealed compartments eg double firewalls, have been drilled to see if any asbestos is contained in the cavity.
4.
The problem with the ABF approach is that of the 9 million pre-2004 cars (which can legally contain asbestos) still registered and on the road, it is estimated that at least 6 million vehicles still retain asbestos-containing (AC) components. These cars present no risk to anyone, including mechanics, provided long established simple, cheap practices are followed. Last financial year, ABF detected 60 second hand vehicles being imported which contained some asbestos. Unless there is a concerted campaign to remove asbestos from the 6 million cars. AC cars still safely using our roads, what is the point in stopping 60 equally safe vehicles a year?

From 1 January 2004, Australia banned the importation and new use of asbestos and ACMs – asbestos containing material

Consumers with other older vehicles are therefore also advised to take precautions when performing do-it-yourself maintenance that might disturb gaskets. A work safety guidance note is available from www.worksafe.vic.gov.au(link is external).

The ACCC therefore saw no need to recall and replace all gaskets – a warning sticker that the vehicle contained asbestos was sufficient

All States have similar published procedures for safely working on vehicles which contain asbestos – in particular, the “Wet Method” can be utilised by home DIY mechanics simply and cheaply. See eg: https://www.worksafe.qld.gov.au/__data/assets/pdf_file/0011/58169/how-to-manage-control-asbestos-in-workplace-cop-2011.pdf.

The essence of the Wet Method is to wear gloves and disposable coveralls and a disposable P1 or P2 respirator mask (from Bunnings), cover the ground under the brake components with plastic sheet do not blow out brake components with compressed air or high pressure water (eg from a garden hose) but use a low-pressure spray bottle (like you get for \$2 from Coles) to wet everything, wipe everything down with wet rags, dispose of them, the plastic and the gloves and coveralls carefully in sealed bags marked asbestos, and take them to the tip where dedicated facilities exist for receiving asbestos waste.

The answer may be because the ABF has been frequently criticised for failing to detect asbestos in a range of imported products – not only the 25,000 Great Wall and Chery cars - but multiple building products thousands of articles such as those used in Qld’s new Executive Building in George St (the Tower of Power) and the Perth Children’s Hospital.

- (b) Oppose the Government position on asbestos in pre-2004 car imports, and seek an exemption for them

Questions I am asked.....

When a vehicle is sold with personalised plates attached, and the ownership of the plate is included in the sale of the vehicle, a Personalised Number Plate/s Transfer Application Form (F2963) must be completed by both the seller and acquirer and submitted to TMR, along with payment of the relevant fee. This is in addition to the standard registration transfer requirements.

When a vehicle with personalised plates is sold, but the ownership of the plates was not included in the sale, the seller is required to replace the personalised plates with standard plates. To do this, the plate owner must complete and submit a Remove and/or Attach Personalised/Customised Number Plate Application Form (F2964), and pay the standard plate fee. The standard plate fee is \$30.20.

When a set of vacant personalised plates are sold, the acquirer is to notify TMR by submitting a completed a Personalised Number Plate/s Transfer Application Form (F2963) (signed by the seller) along with the relevant fee to TMR.

The current fee for transferring a personalised plate is \$101.80. It should be noted that this fee is exempted in a number of situations, such as when the personalised plate is gifted by an immediate family member (spouse, parent, child), a beneficiary, administrator or executor of a deceased estate or when the plates are purchased as a gift (for example, as a birthday present).

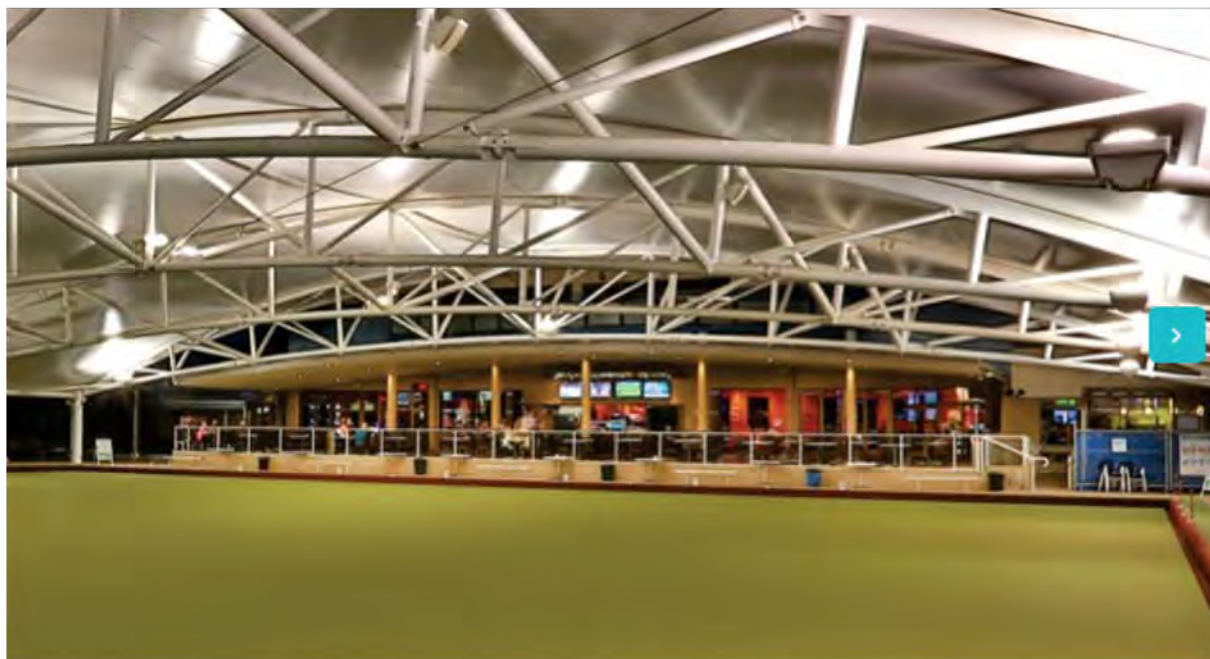
