MEMBERS PRESENT AT THE MEETING WHO ARE CELEBRATING BIRTHDAYS THIS MONTH WERE GIVEN A FREE RAFFLE TICKET IN TONIGHT'S RAFFLE. No takers for the free tickets this month.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

Honorary Membership: David Irving has completed a draft change to the constitution to incorporate this. Chris Holst reminded the members that this proposal is about allowing members to stay in the club if Mustang ownership is no longer practical for health reasons. Vic Newland suggested that we introduce life memberships for long standing members, but John Greene and Chris Holst gave examples where this could create problems. Terminology is also an issue. Once the final draft of the necessary amendments to the constitution are in place, hopefully early next year, this will be put to the membership as required by our constitution and the Dept. of Fair Trading. **Change of Run Date:** More details for and against. It was decided that there will be for and against points in the next two magazines and a vote taken from the floor at the January 2018 meeting. If people are unable to attend this meeting, please email a committee member with your vote. Ray Law moved & John Greene seconded this motion and was carried by a majority of the members.

Charity Support: There has been a suggestion that we have a base amount as a minimum donation and a % of the profits whichever is the greatest. No final decision made on this at present.

2018 Concours: LCC has been in contact as they are wanting to lock in a date for the What's on calendar for 2018. Yo Holst spoke of the tremendous effort put in by this year's committee. Russell suggested that we stage the event every two years to keep up the public's interest. It was decided we ask LCC to lock in 2019 and then we can re-appraise the situation keeping in mind that our Nationals will be in 2021. Les Nye suggested we have just a Show & Shine, but there is the same amount of organising involved. The 2017 Concours Committee have put a lot of information in place, so it will be a bit easier for the next committee. It was moved that we approach LCC intending to lock in the second Sunday in September 2019.

QHMC: At the October meeting John Greene was told that club members were not interested in his reports of the QHMC & MOCC meetings. John was told that the Management Committee had decided to dispense with his reports forever. This was not correct. The management committee did discuss this matter, as several members had voiced concerns that some of the contents were of no interest to them, but at no time did they make a decision to suspend John's reports. Martin Schmidt & Russell Whitney spoke of John being a past president and a member of over 30 years standing, and he deserves to be shown some respect in this regard. John asked was this the view of the members and or just the committee. The majority of members and committee voted to continue with John's reports.

John then explained why he reports on all details from the meetings. The mention of buses, motor bikes etc are to show that our voices at MOCC are being heard & recognised. There are other clubs that attend these QHMC & MOCC meetings. John also said that if members had problems with the TMR they could email him, and he would get an answer for them.

General: Neil De San Miguel asked about the possibility that the club purchase 3 two- way radios for use on the runs. It would help to keep the convoy moving in the right direction. John said in the early days some of the members had CB radios in their Mustangs and it did work quite well. Chris asked Neil to obtain some details to present at the next meeting, but that they needed to have a wide range to be of benefit.

Proposal to Change the MOCA Monthly Club Run Date

The vote on this issue at the January 2018 meeting is intended to enable us to move forward, putting this brief disruption behind us and getting on with promoting and enjoying our Club, our cars and the friendships we have made. We will respect and enact the majority decision.

The proposal will be; that we change the monthly club run date from the first Sunday to the third Sunday of each month. Once this motion is moved and seconded, all members present will be asked to vote by a show of hands as usual.

The voting format for this issue/proposal has changed based on discussions and input from members at the November meeting. This is not a constitutional change so it does not require a postal vote to include all members. It is a proposal that will affect quite a few members who do not always attend the monthly meetings, so the vote has been held over until January to afford these members the opportunity to attend the meeting or to proxy vote by email. Emails shall be sent to a committee member no later than 17 January 2018, one week before the meeting, so they can be collated and tallied. Emails received after the cut-off will not be counted. The email proxy votes will be added to the show of hands result but will not be shown or discussed before the show of hands.

Points for the Proposal:

- 1. Changing the date of the MOCA(Qld) Inc. monthly club run will allow those who are also financial members of the Pony Car Club to attend most runs conducted by both clubs.
- 2. Changing the run date may increase MOCA membership by encouraging more 'dual members' from the Pony Car Club.
- 3. The September run would no longer conflict with some family commitments on Father's Day, likewise the October run would not be on a long weekend.

Points against the Proposal:

- 1. MOCA and the Pony Car Club are not affiliated in any way and follow different Constitutional Rules including Objectives. We should consider the objectives and members of our club ahead of other clubs and their membership
- 2. Changing the club run date was proposed at the Annual General Meeting of the Pony Car Club approximately 4 to 5 years ago. The proposal was voted on at that meeting and was solidly defeated.
- 3. MOCA club runs have been on the first Sunday for 30+ years. Why dispense with a tradition that remains popular and still works well? A good example is the Fathers Day Run on the first Sunday in September. This is usually one of our biggest runs, often attracting 80 to 100 members.
- 4. There are approximately a dozen members (plus partners) who are members of both MOCA and the Pony Car club. It is a group of these members who are most interested to change the MOCA run date.
- 5. If we change from the first Sunday it may impact on some of our members who might also be members of other clubs that use the third Sunday as their run day. Changing to suit some may disadvantage others.





Delegates Report November

This is an article from Courier Mail November 11th that I have sent to MOCC For explanation! I do know a performance Vehicle is 350KW Per T.

"What designates a performance vehicle?

Are Classic Vehicles included:- Pontiac GTO – Shelby – Triumph Tiger etc. As performance? Is there a formula?

Who picks the small time importers allowed and will it impact on personal imports? Is this for vehicles coming from Japan only? BMW and Porsche are not Japanese? How does this fit with New ADR rules?"

Seeking to Remove the Luxury Car Tax (LCT) in Australia.

While it should only apply to new cars sold in Australia, the LCT also applies to the importation of cars of any age whose landed cost exceeds the LCT threshold of approx \$65,000 (including freight insurance and GST). On higher value cars, with GST, this can amount to 40% of the landed cost in Australia, with no corresponding increase in the value of the car. Essentially, this makes the importation into Australia of high value classic cars prohibitive. Very sadly there is only a one-way trade, with a corresponding net loss to Australia's once-impressive heritage car fleet.

The LCT leads to cars leaving the country but not being replaced and ensures less local economic activity as a result. It makes no sense for this tax to apply it to older vehicles as it was introduced to protect the Australian car manufacturing industry, which as we also know, now no longer exists.

The Australian Historic Car Tax Reform Group has been convened by the RACV with the objective of removing the LCT from the importation of cars over 30 years old. Doug Young of the VCCQ chairs it. It includes the VSCC (Vic), VCCA(V), Vintage Drivers Club, National Motor Museum, the Victorian peak bodies for historic car clubs (AOMC, FVVCVC), and multiple one-make car clubs (Alvis CC Vic, MG Car Club Vic, Bugatti Club, Bentley Drivers Club (Vic), the VCCQ etc).

The Group is preparing a comprehensive submission to the Australian Government seeking to exempt the importation of cars over 30 years old from this tax.

As part of this submission the Group is seeking to demonstrate the "one-way valve effect of the LCT" by providing details of any cars over 30 years old, valued at over \$65,000 (the LCT threshold) that have been exported or imported in the last 5 years (please send details of cars that fit these criteria to doug_young@iinet.net.au).

The Group would also like information on your cars, their operating cost, and your intentions should a luxury car tax not exist. This information will, in summary and non-attributable form, be part of the comprehensive and broadly supported submission. Please note that unless you wish to provide your name and phone number, it is entirely anonymous.




CLUB RUN CALENDAR


