

SIVS and Impromptu Events

There has been a lot of interest in this refinement of the Special Interest Vehicle Scheme, and various clubs have chosen to implement it in different ways. A revised edition of the QHMC Bulletin 2019-1 about this is attached.

There have also been a lot of questions, and we understand that some clubs are proposing to contact the Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) directly with them.

With the QHMC having secured this refinement, can we please ask that questions be directed to the QHMC, and not to the Department directly. The whole idea of having a peak body represent multiple clubs in discussions with the State Government is just that. We will answer what we can, but any we can't we will pass on to TMR in an organised way, and then report back to you all.

The thing to stress is this is <u>not</u> a revolution in the way SIVS works in Qld. Ever since listing events on a club's website or social media page became permissible in 2016, a number of clubs have allowed individual members to create a club event, at short notice, by "posting" the event on either the website or social media (SM) page. (Generally, the SM page has been Facebook, but it can be any one of a number of possible social media pages.) There is no SIVS requirement for a club's Management Committee to create an event, and how any club chooses to implement this is up to them. In WA, where Impromptu Events have been in place for 2 years now, some clubs allow a member to post the event directly on the Club Website or social media page. Others require an email from the member to the Committee or webmaster – there is no fixed requirement.

Calling a member-initiated-event an "Impromptu Event" is simply applying the title afforded to such events under the WA Historic Registration scheme, which is very similar to Qld's. The QHMC considers this is an excellent idea as it means Qld is simply doing the same thing as is permitted in WA, and calling it the same thing. All States and Territories have entered into various agreements between themselves and the Commonwealth over the years with the intention that there be a uniform set of rules applying to road vehicles across the country.

One of the questions that keeps arising is: where is the legislation for Impromptu Events in Qld? The answer is: there is no specific legislation, just as there is no specific legislation for SIVS generally. It is all policy pronouncements.

Another question is: what type of use is envisaged by Impromptu Events? The answer is: enthusiast type use, and not every-day type vehicle use. So no work-commuting, no work use, no hiring out, no use for running down to the shops etc. But a trip to meet another enthusiast would be OK. Or a picnic. Or to pick up a friend from the airport who would enjoy the experience.

Some clubs appear to think a Log Book scheme, such as Victoria's, would be preferable to this. The main reason given is that some members do not have internet access, and for them it would be easier to simply fill in a book with a pen, than going online.

While this might be easier for individual members, the downside is that a Log Book scheme puts an enormous burden on each club, as well as the State Government – and the State has previously advised that if it were to adopt a Log Book scheme, the costs would be passed on via increased registration charges. The Victorian Government website dealing with Log Books is 16 pages long, and the AOMC (the Victorian peak body – similar to the QHMC) Log Book

Handbook for club members is 26 pages long. Clubs in Victoria have to become accredited, enter into a prescriptive agreement with the State Government etc – and that's just to be able to participate in the Log Book scheme. There are then multiple ongoing obligations for each club.

For Qld club members who do not have internet access it will be far easier for the Club to nominate someone to receive calls from them who can then go onto the website or SM page and list it for them. Or they could simply "Phone a Friend" who has internet access who could then list it for them. This burden would be infinitesimally small compared with the Club obligations a Log Book scheme would impose. They would then need to carry a copy of the internet page showing the event, or whoever sets it up for them could send a copy by text to the member's mobile phone.

The WA CMC (WA's equivalent of the QHMC), who came up with the Impromptu Event idea, say they now have the best Historic Registration scheme in the country – far better than the Log Book schemes elsewhere. WA's scheme has been operating without a hitch for 2 years. Qld's SIVS Impromptu Events now has fewer restrictions than WA. It is really important to manage this quietly and not create issues by contacting TMR directly.


In closing, we reiterate the need not to trumpet this as a revolution, as it is not.

And at the risk of sounding like a cracked record, PLEASE do not contract TMR directly about it. The QHMC is your conduit for this purpose, and we are happy discharge this function for you.

QHMC Bulletin 2018-1.2 Special Interest Vehicle Scheme

To:QHMC Club Delegates and Affiliated ClubsSubject:Special Interest Vehicle Scheme

WA has an Historic Registration Scheme similar to ours which allows Club Events and road testing. One refinement of their scheme is the "Impromptu Event", which allows an individual club member to initiate a Club Event at short notice. This has theoretically been possible in Qld since 2016, when the Qld Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) allowed club events to be listed on a Club's Social Media (SM) page. Some clubs have since then allowed individual members to initiate an event by posting on the SM page.

TMR has now agreed to us describing member-initiated events as "Impromptu Events" here in Qld.

TMR advise that "the Department of Transport and Main Roads is happy for Queensland incorporated car clubs to manage "impromptu events" on <u>a case by case basis</u>, <u>as long as the event is added to the incorporated clubs</u> <u>newsletter, website or social media page.</u>" They acknowledge it can be for "one or more" vehicles. (The full email is reproduced at the end of this Bulletin.)

This will give many of the benefits of a Log Book scheme without the costs, restrictions and administrative burdens Log Books create for the member, club officials and Government.

It is up to individual clubs whether they want to participate in the scheme or not, and how they implement it.

In WA, clubs effect this in 2 ways:

- 1. By the member sending an email to the club nominating the event which then goes on the club website, or
- 2. By filling in an on-line form, which results in it becoming a listed event automatically. The form can be set up so a password is needed to access it.

In WA they do not have the option of it being listed on the Club's Social Media page and in Qld we do not have listing on a Club Run Log as an option.

In deciding how to implement this, clubs need to take security into account, as thieves can target residences when they can find out the owner is away.

This can be addressed in a number of ways. 2 possibilities are:

- 1. Password-protected online form and Events Page on the club website. There are 2 problems with passwords:
 - a. People forget them, and
 - b. They can be passed on to others.

2. By creating a closed-group Facebook Page for the club, only accessible to financial members, on which they can establish events. This can be by a Facebook post. The Facebook page manager invites members to join the page once they tell him their Facebook ID. If they don't pay their subs they are removed from the Group.

Where members do not have Facebook or Internet access, despite the inconvenience to the club's webmaster/Facebook page manager, they could ring up to have an Impromptu Event listed.

It is important to carry with you evidence of the Impromptu Event being created. This could be a printed page or where someone established the event for you, they could send a text to your mobile phone with a screen shot of the entry.

This will also allow club members in remote locations to use their cars more often, as well as shift workers and fly-in fly-out workers who are unable to attend organised club runs.

It needs to be stressed again that SIVS-registered vehicles cannot be used for commuting to and from work, as a work vehicle, or for hire or reward. That would void their insurance if an accident occurs. There is increasing use of automatic number plate recognition in police cars, on overpasses etc., and it won't be long before a press of one button will reveal the usage of a particular number plate. Frequent repeated use on one stretch of road will be detectable and in the event of a claim, insurers will look, as always, for any way to avoid liability.

This is a great privilege – let's not abuse it.

Ask yourself the question, is your Mustang over 30 years of age and do you really want to have your classic car on full registration? There will be a number of members that will say "yes" as there are a few people in our club that prefer to be able to drive their baby when ever their little heart desires, however with the busy lives that most people have these days, the poor old girl will more than likely just sit in the garage for a couple of weeks on occasions and not get driven at all, except for the monthly club run hopefully, and other sanctioned runs.

As we are getting quite a number of new members each and every month, this letter is aimed primarily at the newer members, and also as a gentle reminder to some of the "not so new" members as well and will reappear from time to time.

In addition to the cheaper Rego (which is only about 20 % of full rego) you may also be able to receive a cheaper premium from your insurer as well, so you are on a win / win situation. Just call your Insurance company and make the inquiry, and if they don't offer you a reduced premium, think about changing to one that does. Just tell them that your car is now on Concessional Rego, it's as easy as that.

As to the usage of your car, there are a few restrictions, but the advantages far outweigh the disadvantages in my opinion.

If you still like to use your car especially at weekends, there are numerous "events of interest" such as Willowbank and Lakeside race days and other motoring events and car shows that appear in our magazine, and on the internet that you can attend legally, as long as it is a " sanctioned " event from an Incorporated Club. We also have a " mid month " run for those members that may be retired, or have that day off, and you will also find these details in your Club Magazine.

If you wish to be updated with the latest events of interest, it's very easy. You can contact our Run Cocoordinator, Neil De San Miguel, (Neil, DSM) and he will put you on his mailing list with all the latest sanctioned events that might be of interest you. His contact details are in the front of your Monthly Magazine or on the web.

To find out more about club rego, just give your friendly Vehicle Dating Officer a call, on (07) 3886 8798 or just send an email to me. The email link is in the front of the club magazine along with all the other club officials. Click on Vehicle dating Officer, and I will steer you in the right direction.

However, a word of warning, if you cease being a member of an "Incorporated Motoring Club" and keep driving your club rego car, or even think about using it as a daily driver, you will face the long arm of the law, and the fines will be very steep and you could also put your club in the "poo"

Remember, Club Rego is a "privilege" and not a "right", please don't stuff it up for others.






