
#### **CLUB RUN CALENDAR**



#### **Member Profile: David and Carolyn Irving**

#### What have we got?

Currently 2 Mustangs in the stable: 1968 California Special (GT/CS), Colour Ink Blue, and 2017 GT, Colour Magnetic.



When and where did we purchase our cars?

We purchased the GT/CS in October 2000 as a private sale from a Brisbane southern suburb. It had already been converted to right-hand drive in Ballina and supplied with a Roadworthy Certificate. When I got it home and had a really good look, I realised we had a mobile death trap on our hands, so the work began!!

The 2017 was a happier exercise. After many months of searching I found a car that had been bought back by a Ford dealer in Melbourne after the owner realised there was limited value in owning it when he lived, worked and played in the same suburb, so the Klms. were low and the price even lower. He had obviously suffered a rush of blood to the brain when they were released.

#### What motivated us to buy a Mustang?

After years of participating in various motor sports, mainly speedway and off-road racing, I needed a car we could just drive around in and have fun. My search began for my childhood dream of either a Studebaker Golden Hawk or a Daimler SP250, but to no avail. Carolyn said, "Why not a Mustang?" Based on that comment and my father's teachings of "If it's not a Ford it will break down", then I saw few other options. I had always trusted my father and also found it safer to sometimes agree with my wife's suggestions.



Work in progress?

Regressing back to my early hot-rodding days I couldn't help myself, so I have done a few mods on the '68 just to satisfy my inner child. Lowered and renewed all suspension, torque thrust D wheels, modified the 289 and exhaust, replaced the front seats and re-covered all with cloth upholstery. After the 2010 Road Trip to the MOCA Nationals in South Oz, the car had a few

stone chips which needed attention which resulted in a complete strip and repaint. We found out at this point that the car had originally been painted Tahoe Turquoise however we moved on to its present colour of Ink Blue. The next job appears to be about fulfilling the desire for Air-conditioning so we can enjoy the hot summer drives. A Fun Fact on the history of this model, with a production run of exactly 6 months, is that it is reputed to be the first model to be fitted with Shelby components on the Ford production line and could be preordered in any configuration of power train, interior or paint. All from the San Jose Plant, there were 3876 GT/CS vehicles built for the California market and 211 GT/HCS (High Country Specials) for the Colorado market with the only visible difference being that instead of the GT/CS badging, the HCS had a High Country Special decal on the side scoops.

I was hopeful of replacing the 2017 with a 2018 GT/CS, but Ford won't play the game, so we'll just leave that car as is for a while.



#### What do we enjoy about our cars?

We just love cruising and road tripping in both cars, but I guess the real enjoyment comes from the nostalgia surrounding the look, feel and technology of the older models.

#### When and why did we join MOCA Qld?

I first joined in about December 2000 but after accidentally letting my membership lapse, I re-joined again in January 2002. Like many members, I wanted to learn more about the vehicles, and I hoped to establish a social connection with people who had a car interest similar to mine.

#### What do we enjoy about being in MOCA Qld?

We are not married to the club but attend meetings and events as often as we reasonably can and always enjoy the interaction with other members whether we are on Road Trips, food outings, motoring events and car displays. Monthly meetings are generally always fun as long as we all adopt the ethos of 'what happens in the meeting, stays in the meeting' and apart from that, who doesn't enjoy a sausage sizzle? Club Runs!!! Well, who doesn't enjoy getting lost, it's such fun? Few clubs are in the enviable position of having their own club rooms which provide a focal point for meetings, a secure storage facility and optional use for in-house events in complete privacy. It's a healthy club with a 40-year history built on the hard work of a lot of volunteers and hopefully some newer members will help lift the load and carry it forward into future years.

#### (Special Interest Vehicle Scheme)

Ask yourself the question, is your Mustang over 30 years of age and do you really want to have your classic car on full registration? There will be a number of members that will say "yes" as there are a few people in our club that prefer to be able to drive their baby when ever their little heart desires. However, with the busy lives that most people have these days, the poor old girl will more than likely just sit in the garage for a couple of weeks on occasions and not get driven at all, except for the monthly club run hopefully, and other sanctioned runs.



#### Battery Trivia or all you need to know about batteries

**Do lead acid batteries discharge when not in use? Yes** - All batteries, regardless of their chemistry, will self-discharge. The rate of self-discharge for lead acid batteries depends on the storage or operating temperature. At a temperature of 30°C. a lead acid battery will self-discharge at an approximate rate of 4% a week. Therefore, a battery with a 125-amp hour rating would self-discharge at a rate of approximately five amps per week. Action - keep your battery charged when not in regular use!

**Do lead acid batteries develop a memory? No** - Lead acid batteries do not develop any type of memory.

**Do I need to completely discharge my lead acid battery before recharging it? No,** in fact you should never discharge your lead acid battery below 80% of its rated capacity. Discharging it below this point or 10.5 volts can cause permanent damage to the battery

**Acid Stratification** The electrolyte in a stratified battery concentrates at the base, starving the upper half of the cell. Acid stratification occurs if the battery stays at low charge (below 80 percent), never receives a full charge and has a number shallow discharges. Driving a car for short distances with the A/C and other accessories engaged contributes to acid stratification because the alternator cannot always apply a saturated charge.

**How to fix a stratified battery** Allow the battery to rest for a few days, then shake the battery to mix the electrolyte or try tipping the battery on its side then upright several times helps correct the problem. Next apply an equalizing charge by raising the voltage of a 12-volt battery to 16 volts for at least an hour but with a maximum of 2 hours. You will need a professional battery charger to do this.

When should I add water to my batteries? How often you use and recharge your batteries will determine the frequency of watering. Also, using batteries in a hot climate will require more frequent watering. It is best to check your battery water level frequently and add distilled water when needed. Never add tap water to your battery. Tap water contains minerals that will reduce battery capacity and increase their self-discharge rate.

Warning - A brand new battery may have a low electrolyte level. Charge the battery first and then add water if needed. Adding water to a battery before charging may result in overflow of the electrolyte.

What is the proper electrolyte level?
Battery electrolyte levels should be just below the bottom of the vent well, about12mm – 18mm above the tops of the separators. Never let the electrolyte level to drop below the top of the plates.

**Do I ever need to add acid to my battery?** Under normal operating conditions, you never need to add acid. Only distilled or deionized water should be added to achieve the recommended electrolyte levels.




#### More Battery Trivia

#### What are the most common mistakes made by owners of lead acid batteries?

- **Undercharging** Generally caused by not allowing the charger to restore the battery to full charge after use. Continuously operating a battery in a partial state of charge, or storing the battery in the discharged state results in the formation of lead sulphate (sulfation) on the plates. Sulfation reduces the performance of the battery and may cause premature battery failure.
- **Overcharging** Continuous-charging causes accelerated corrosion of the positive plates, excessive water consumption and in some cases, damaging temperatures within the battery. Lead acid batteries should be charged after each discharge of more the 50% of its rated capacity and during or after prolonged storage of 30 days or more.
- **Under-watering** In lead acid batteries water is lost during the charging process. If the electrolyte level drops below the tops of the plates, irreparable damage may occur. Check your battery water level frequently.

• **Over-watering** - Excessive watering of a battery results in additional dilution of the electrolyte, resulting in reduced battery performance. Add water to your battery after it has been fully charged, never when the battery is partially discharged.



In the **previous section,** I discussed car batteries but only referred to one type of battery, the standard lead acid battery as it is the cheapest and most common type of battery used in cars. However, there are several other batteries types available, most have specific advantages over the conventional lead acid battery but this advantage comes at a cost.

**Calcium batteries** take up a large proportion of the battery market and have the same generic make-up of wet cell batteries except both the lead/antimony alloy positive and negative plates are replaced by lead calcium alloy. By doing this, the fluid loss is about 80% lower than that of a normal wet cell battery and the self-discharge rate is also considerably lower.

**Absorbed Glass Mat (AGM)** or 'dry' batteries as they're also known are the latest step in the evolution of lead-acid batteries. Instead of using water or a gel, an AGM uses a fibreglass separator to hold the electrolyte in place.

**GEL batteries** GEL batteries use a gelled acid electrolyte. GEL batteries can withstand deep discharging and are used in vehicles with demanding electric equipment such as electric wheelchairs and golf buggies
