The first three session were half hour a piece, and were heavily populated by the new models, it good to see the cars getting a good exercise run,







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Well you all understood the symbolic heading, immediately deciphering the molecular structure and the chemical formulae then realised the impact on our treasured Mustangs.

First a little history, when our cars were designed (original metal Mustangs) Tetraethyl lead (TEL) was a vital additive in fuel. Developed in 1920 by GM and Standard Oil, TEL was needed to raise the octane level in petrol. Which in turn allowed an engine's compression to be increased without premature detonation occurring, otherwise known as "knocking or pinking". Increased compression allowing engines to develop more power for a similar fuel consumption.

As engine power developed it was found that the lead residue from TEL prevented a major problem, **valve seat recession**. This discovery led to an engine manufacturing cost reduction, the removal of valve seat inserts, valve seats were now machined directly into the head.

The use of TEL as a fuel additive continued until the late 1990's, its use in road vehicles was totally stopped on Jan 1st, 2000. During the 80 years TEL was used engine technology advanced significantly, fuel refining technology advanced but the health of the children in cities and alongside motorways declined. The health issue was the main driver to force the removal of TEL from petrol. It was the health issues which accelerated the development of petrol refining technology allowing the octane rating of petrol to be increased at little additional cost, alleviating the "pinking" problem, and need for TEL. But engine manufacturers had to revert to the installation of hardened steel valve seats. This was not a big problem as engine manufacturers were now using more and more aluminium heads and these required steel valve seats. A further reason forcing change was the introduction of Catalytic converted to vehicle exhausts to reduce emissions; lead poisoned the catalyst.

A little-known fact is that a car running Tetraethyl lead containing fuel, used a set of spark-plugs annually, a muffler only lasted 2~3 years, the exhaust pipe 5 years, while engine oil and oil filters only had a service life of 5,000 miles. The change to unleaded petrol also had other engine impacts, reduced ring wear, less rusting within the engine, lower sludge and varnish formation, and reduced wear in the cam and lifter areas.

Now we understand why TEL was used and why it had to be removed from petrol, **how does that effect your Mustang**. Well not all that much, unless you drive your car a lot and drive it hard. It will take at least 75,000 to 100,000 miles to really impact on a normally driven car. TEL replacement additives can be used but these can cost more than the valve seat upgrade.

So, what will happen to a Mustang with soft valve seats, under conditions of high speed, and high load, and in the absence of special protection for the valve seat, no TEL? It has been found that the material of the valve seat can be eroded away allowing the valves to "recede" into the cylinder head. In extreme cases this can cause lower compression, poor fuel economy, high emissions and other mechanical problems.

What Fuel should I feed a Mustang?

The gas or fuel Octane rating a Mustang requires is totally dependent on the compression ratio of the engine and which octane standard is used, the US of A or the rest of the world.

So why worry about octane rating??

It is all about fuel detonation in the cylinder and getting it to happen correctly. If fuel doesn't detonate correctly you can get "knocking, pinging or pinking". This happens when the air fuel mix does not ignite in one smooth event but happens as several discrete events, this costs power and can damage the engine. There are several factors that can affect an engine allowing it to have detonation problems. The most common ones are; induction air temperature, humidity, altitude, engine temperature and spark timing. Those of us with modern cars are fortunate as the engine management system (EMS) will compensate for most of these problems by advancing and retarding the ignition timing. This is where the EMS slightly adjusts the point in the ignition cycle at which the spark is generated at the spark plug. Most modern cars have knock sensors in the engine at multiple places. These detect the shock caused by detonation then signal the EMS to change the ignition timing to eliminate the problem

However, those of use with "Classic metal muscle" with mechanical must adjust the timing very accurately to remove the knock, but too far advanced and the engine will overheat and "pink". Too far retarded the engine will also overheat and loose power. And all these problems is without worrying about the petrol's octane number to use.

There are two systems used to express the octane number of petrol. The **RON** (Research octane number) and the **MON** (Motor Octane Number). The RON test simulates fuel performance under low severity engine operation. The MON simulates more severe operation that might be incurred at high speed or high load and can be as much as 10 points lower than the RON.

Australian 95 unleaded is RON 95 octane but it's the equivalent of **American MON 89** octane. So, when reading specifications check if they are US or the rest of the world.

In summary **E10 RON 91 or ULP91** will be OK in all standard (but special) Mustangs, the higher performance higher compression engined Mustangs must use **RON 95** as a minimum. But there is a bit of a silver lining, higher-octane fuels have a higher density that will provide a bigger bang for the buck translating to better fuel economy.
