

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QHMC Delegates Report



URGENT Special General Meeting

A Special General Meeting of QHMC was called by three members of the committee, calling for the replacement of the President Trevor Beutel because they felt he was lacking the guidance to continue in the role of President. Even though he had not done anything wrong and had acheived a lot with fixing the TAX problems over the last five years.

Trevor read out a RIGHT of reply to the accusations levelled against him and resigned from the presidency.

A secret ballet was called and Tom Lewis was installed as President. Tom Lewis was one of the two people who organised the formation of the umbrella group now calling itself Queensland Historic Motoring Council, QHMC.

One delegate stood up at the meeting and said he had been SOLICITED over the phone for a Proxy Vote, and had come to the meeting to see how his Proxy would be used. He was not impressed when he realised the vote could for whatever the person he had signed his proxy to wanted to use it for. He withdrew his proxy.

The delegate from the Austin Healey Club wanted the complete committee replaced on the night, pointing out that the future of our "Collector" vehicles is in jeopardy with the pollution figures the government is signing, that must effect our vehicles. So we need to to have a strong committee as we will have to lobby the government, showing how we are an assset not a liability.

The committe remains the same with only the president changing, as the annual general meeting is less that six months away.

There was over twice the number of delegates at the meeting showing that the clubs do follow what goes on and care about their Council.







TESLA VERSUS A V8

Forwarded as received. Food for thought.

There was a news article about this the other day after one of our pollys said by the year 2030 he was hoping to have more electric cars than ever blah blah

The article then went on to say there is no infrastructure for that many people to have electric cars and electricity like your article says still has to come from somewhere.

Bringing back the dark ages might be a real thing soon.

Interesting; I have never seen figures for the cost of re-charging an electric car. In the USA of course they have a 110-volt network, so the charging might take longer, with a higher amperage, and thus be more expensive. Every time I've seen a Tesla I have salivated, and a cousin of Susie's has bought one and so far, is very happy. The power has to come from somewhere, though, and I think we would have the same overloading problems here if every man and his dog had one.

And you can charge a battery in less than ten hours, but your battery will die much sooner. The only efficient way is to trickle-charge it. Unless somebody invents a battery that can somehow handle it.

This came as an email from one of the guys in the USA and while the figures relate to their costs the comment is interesting.

As an engineer, I love the electric vehicle technology. However, I have been troubled for a long time by the fact that the electrical energy to keep the batteries charged has to come from the grid and that means more power generation and a huge increase in the distribution infrastructure. Whether generated from coal, gas, oil, wind or sun, installed generation capacity is limited. A friend sent me the following that says it very well. You should all take a look at this short article.

In case you were thinking of buying a hybrid or an electric car:

Ever since the advent of electric cars, the REAL cost per mile of those things has never been discussed. All you ever heard was the mpg in terms of gasoline, with **nary a mention of the cost of electricity to run it**. This is the first article I've ever seen and tells the story pretty much as I expected it to

Electricity has to be one of the least efficient ways to power things yet they're being shoved down our throats. Glad somebody finally put **engineering and math** to paper.

At a neighbourhood BBQ, I was talking to a neighbour, a BC Hydro executive. I asked him how that renewable thing was doing. He laughed, then got serious. If you really intend to adopt electric vehicles, he pointed out, you had to face certain realities. For example, a home charging system for a Tesla requires 75-amp services. The average house is equipped with a 100-amp service. On our small street (approximately 25 homes), the electrical infrastructure would be unable to carry more than three houses with a single Tesla, each. For even half the homes to have electric vehicles, the system would be wildly over-loaded.

This is the elephant in the room with electric vehicles. Our residential infrastructure cannot bear the load. So as our genius elected officials promote this nonsense, not only are we being urged to buy these things and replace our reliable, cheap generating systems with expensive, new windmills and solar cells, but we will also have to renovate our entire delivery system! This latter "investment" will not be revealed until we're so far down this dead-end road that it will be presented with an 'OOPS...!' and a shrug.

If you want to argue with a green person over cars that are eco-friendly, just read the following. Note: If you ARE a green person, read it anyway. It's enlightening.

Eric test drove the **Chevy Volt** at the invitation of General Motors, and he writes, "For four days in a row, the **fully charged battery lasted only 25 miles before the Volt switched to the reserve gasoline engine**." Eric calculated the car got **30 mpg** including the 25 miles it ran on the battery. So, the range including the 9-gallon gas tank and the 16 kWh batteries is approximately 270 miles.

It will take you 4.5 hours to drive 270 miles at 60 mph. Then add **10 hours to charge the battery** and you have a total trip time of 14.5 hours. In a typical road trip, your average speed (including charging time) would be 20 mph. According to General Motors, the Volt battery holds 16 kWh of electricity. It takes a full 10 hours to charge a drained battery.

The cost for the electricity to charge the Volt is never mentioned, so I looked up what I pay for electricity. I pay approximately (it varies with amount used and the seasons) \$1.16 per kWh. 16 kWh x \$1.16 per kWh = \$18.56 to charge the battery. \$18.56 per charge divided by 25 miles = \$0.74 per mile to operate the Volt using the battery. Compare this to a similar size car with a gasoline engine that gets only 32 mpg. \$3.19 per gallon divided by 32 mpg = \$0.10 per mile.

The gasoline-powered car costs about \$20,000 while the Volt costs \$46,000-plus. So, the American Government wants loyal Americans not to do the math, but simply pay three times as much for a car, that costs more than seven times as much to run and takes three times longer to drive across the country.

There's nothing quite like a rumbling petrol-driven V8!!!
