GENERAL BUSINESS:

- Chris Holst told members that John Binge reminded him tonight that our Club started the 4th March 1980, 38 years ago.
- Chris Holst presented Louis Spelta with his and Graces 30-year continuous membership badges. John Hardacre was also presented with his 30-year badge.
- Barry Lane thanked the four members who contributed to the mission statement. The Club mission statement is as follows "To share Ford Mustang experiences, whilst enjoying the fellowship of like-minded people" Tom Lucy suggested the grammar change and it was accepted, it now reads "whilst" not "while". It was proposed by Louis Spelta and seconded by Linda Abraham that this is the Mission Statement for the Club, it was voted on and all 48 members present voted in agreement.
- Neil de san Miguel asked members to not belittle other member's cars, when on runs or just out and about. Neil also asked for members to help take sick children on outings in their cars if the sick person wishes to go on a ride in a Mustang. Neil will look into this further as there may be a requirement for Blue Cards.
- **Change of Constitution for members who can no longer drive or own a Mustang.** There was much discussion on this topic; there will be two articles in magazine regarding this matter. One is written by David Irving with submissions for changes to Constitution to allow for this item to be included, and the correct wording that is required. The other article is titled Classes of Members. Chris Holst urged all Members to read these two very important articles, as there will be a vote on this subject. Members who cannot drive or own their Mustang any longer for medical reasons are asked to contact the Management Committee. John Green spoke on Life Membership in other Clubs and the problems that they have had. Vic Newland stated that the Pony Club have Life Members. Some other States have Life Members, but it is a different form of Membership. Our Club is governed by our National Body, Martin Schmidt is doing some research into if and how other Clubs under the National Body go about introducing Life Members.

Les Nye suggested that if Members can no longer drive they get a letter from Doctor, Chris said no need for this as we take our Members on trust. Vic Newland suggested we vote on recognising long serving Members who have made contributions to the Club; this will be discussed separately later on. David Irving said the Constitution was written in 1980 and it suited the day then, but we have progressed and changed, and David has made many changes to the Constitution over the years. David has also been in touch with Dept. of Fair Trading regarding the changes to the Constitution for this matter. Chris Holst said that the Club wants all Members to be same and treated the same, not differently. Linda Abraham said we should thank David Irving for all the work he does with the Constitution, a round of applause followed. If you have any suggestions, please consult the Management Committee.
- The subject of the dangerous airbags was brought up by Ric Dunford and Wayne Hall said he had been in touch with Ford today and they said there weren't any available replacement airbags. Maybe there will be some in August; these will be sent to the dealer or to relevant person. Wayne also said ACCC have got all the records.
- Barry Lane welcomed a new member who was late as he couldn't find the clubhouse... welcome to Greg Itoy from Camira, he has a 67 Coupe.
- Chris Holst mentioned he attended the last QHMC Meeting with John Green.
- Barry Lane thanked John Green for answering questions from a prospective Mustang owner today, Barry said he couldn't answer the questions, but John sorted it all out.
- Russell Whitney told members that Harry and Carolyn Steinheuer, Wayne and Elaine Hall and himself and Sandra are off in their caravans on an expedition over to WA for the Nationals, then touring all around WA and heading up North and crossing over to NT for a few months, then Coober Pedy and Melbourne then home via Bathurst in Oct. President's Report - March 2018

We are considering a constitutional change. That statement can be seen as many things good and bad by almost as many people. Some will welcome change, others may not or may think the change doesn't go far enough. My original career was in aviation where change is inevitable but must be carefully managed, designed and thoroughly tested before implementation. Any changes must bring improvement without increased risks or any nasty side effects. This is exactly what the committee is trying to achieve.

The proposed change will allow current members who can no longer own and drive a Mustang for health reasons to continue as members if they so wish. Nothing more and nothing less. The proposed additions and the current text of Section 4 of our Constitution are in this edition of the magazine. We have also published some very good work by David Irving which includes the steps we have to follow to complete any changes and some good advice about approaching and managing change. This will be discussed further in general business at the March General Meeting.

We are all getting good opportunities to exercise the horses. The Memorial Run in conjunction with PCCA to O'Reilleys Winery and the mid-month/mid-week Run to Sea Salt & Vine in particular have been well patronised and very enjoyable.

Proposal for A Change to The Constitution of MOCA (Qld) Inc.

1. There are a number of critical steps which need to be addressed to enable any change to the subject Constitution and these are:

- a. Class of Members. As stated in my email, I suggest this should be designated as 'Honorary Member'.
- b. Membership. The number of Honorary Members shall not exceed the number of more than 5% of total Ordinary Members. Spouses/partners of Honorary Members **are not** granted any form of membership; however, they may attend meetings or club events and are subject to the rules applicable to the Honorary member.
- c. Nomination for Honorary Membership. Every application must be made in writing to the Secretary of the club and signed by both the Ordinary Member and the Nominee. A nomination for Honorary Membership may only be made by a financial Ordinary Member of the club.
- d. Membership Fees. Honorary members, as in many institutions/clubs, are not required to pay fees but **do not** have Voting Rights.
- e. Approval Process. Nominations received by the Secretary are to be vetted for suitability at a meeting of the Management Committee. Suitable nominations are then presented at a General Meeting and voted on by the members present. Nominees, whether successful or not, are to be notified in writing by the Secretary. Successful nominations should normally be based on a nominee having contributed significantly to the club over a period of years, including having served in club appointments. Other approval criteria may include individuals who have assisted the club by providing sponsorships and consideration may be given to Ordinary Members who for reasons of age or ill health can no longer satisfy the requirements of that Class of Member.
- f. Annual Review. All Honorary Members positions are to be reviewed annually as an Item of Business following the election of the new committee at the Annual General Meeting. Notwithstanding the annual review, an Honorary Member can have such membership terminated at any time should the Management Committee deem that some action or activity reflects negatively on the club. When a membership is terminated during the review process the member is to be notified in writing by the Secretary.
- g. Honorary Member Register. The Management Committee is to maintain an Honorary Member Register similar but separate to the Ordinary Member Register.
- h. Right of Appeal. A Honorary Member or Applicant does not have the right of appeal for rejection of an application or termination of Member status.

2. The items I have listed above are those which I believe the Management Committee should discuss as a bare minimum. They are my thoughts only with a view to ensuring the essence of the club remains as is without compromising the Objectives of the Constitution. There are a couple of steps which the Department of Fair Trading may look at closely, the first being that we clearly define and pass a 'Special Resolution' for the proposed change to the constitution at a General Meeting. The following is what I would suggest needs to be proposed, seconded and voted on at the next General Meeting:

Motion (Special Resolution)

'To request all Ordinary Members to vote on a proposal to amend the Constitution of the Mustang Owners Club of Australia (Queensland) Inc., to change the 'Classes of Members' to also include a class of member described as 'Honorary Member' and the governance of such members shall be in accordance with the Rules of the Association.'

3. This Motion must first be voted in the affirmative by at least $\frac{3}{4}$ of the number of members present who are entitled to vote. Should that motion be accepted, then a vote for the amendment, including any relevant details as outlined in para1 above, will need to be carried out. The easiest way to do this would be via a simple Yes/No form published in the newsletter calling for votes and checking the responses off against a member listing, keeping in mind that spouses/partners have equal voting rights. Critical – The Application to Dept. of Fair Trading must be submitted within 3 months of the passing of the Special Resolution.

4. Should the result be in the affirmative, then I can formulate the paragraphing and there would be three changes submitted to the Dept. of Fair Trading:

- a. Amendment to existing Para 4 by incorporating change to Classes of members.
- b. Insert new Para 11 pertaining to rules for Honorary Members.
- c. Renumber Existing paragraphs and Index as necessary.

5. As I said, these are only my thoughts and feel free to chop them up as much as you like, but this is not an issue to be taken lightly or too hastily.

4. CLASSES OF MEMBERS

- (a) The membership of the Association shall consist of 'Ordinary Members';
- (b) The number of Ordinary Members shall be unlimited;
- (c) 'Ordinary Members' are persons who are over the age of eighteen years who are owners of a Ford Mustang motor vehicle, and based on the personal information available to them have been considered and accepted by a meeting of the Management Committee.

4. CLASSES OF MEMBERS

- (a) The membership of the Association shall consist of 'Ordinary Members';
- (b) The number of Ordinary Members shall be unlimited;
- (c) 'Ordinary Members' are persons who are over the age of eighteen years who are owners of a Ford Mustang motor vehicle and based on the personal information available to them have been considered and accepted by a meeting of the Management Committee.
- (d) 'Ordinary Members' may also be members who are current Ordinary Members as defined by 4(c) above, but for health reasons are no longer able to own or operate a Ford Mustang motor vehicle. Continuing membership under this rule shall be at the sole discretion of the Management Committee and subject to annual review, with numbers limited to not more than 5% of the total club membership.
- (e) Applications to continue Ordinary Membership in accordance with 4(d) above must be made in writing to the Club Secretary for consideration by the Management Committee.

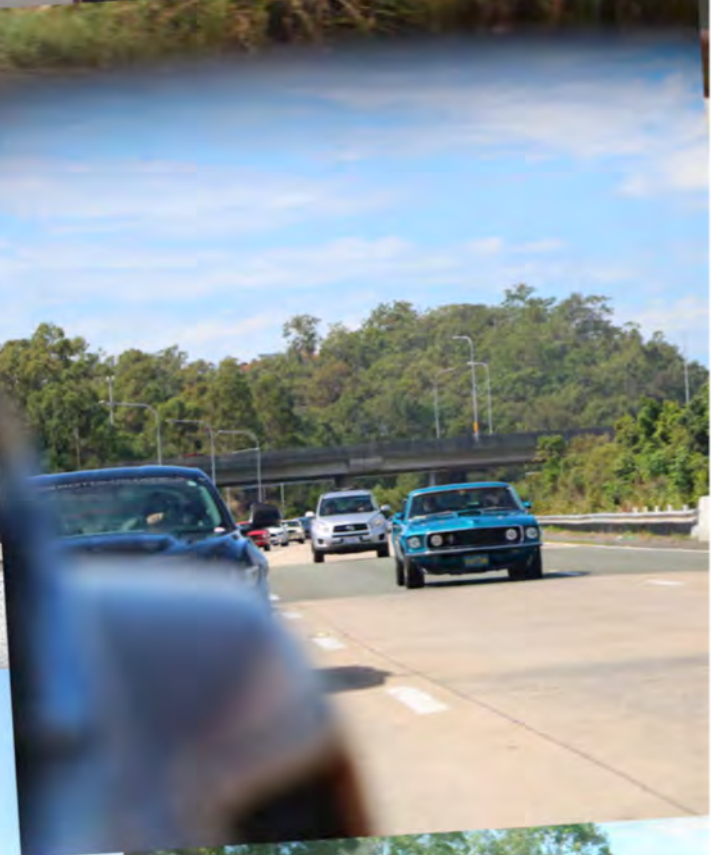

After some long deliberation I made the decision to go the Mustang way mainly because as a kid, I had great memories of the classic battles of the Mustang's at Calder Raceway near Melbourne where I lived, with the likes of Norm Beachey, Bob Jane, and Ian "Pete" Geoghan. Back in those day's these powerful beasts amazed all the fans who attended as everybody loved their speed and sound of the big V8's as well. One day while pondering over the current trusty Trading Post I noticed that there was a '65 Coupe for sale in a neighbouring suburb. When I looked at it and found it to be in a thousand bits, which was a bit of a shock at first, but this also allowed me the chance to give the gutted body a thorough inspection for rust and other nasties that may be otherwise hidden, and I was pleased to find only a small section of rust which was easy to repair. After talking it over with Robyn, she said that the only thing stopping me from buying it was "ME", so within a couple of days I had the body at home in my garage surrounded by boxes and boxes of wiring & other stuff, it was November 2001.

Phase one - Work in progress I hung all these bits on hooks around the workshop and proceeded to take each component, strip it down, overhaul and repaint it, re-bag and hang it back where it came from. Within a few months I had run out of bagged bits to overhaul so started to put them back where they belong on this old body (not mine, the Coupe). It wasn't too long before I installed the engine and gearbox and was really keen to actually drive the baby. So, I did, mind you, I still didn't have any glass in it, no doors, mud guards, or seats fitted, just a couple of Coke boxes to sit on, with a lawn mower jerry can rigged up for a fuel tank. Robyn sat on the passengers Coke box holding on to the "A" pillar & our little miniature foxie as we drove it around the block early one evening. Naughty, Naughty, but it was fun, then I got Robyn to drive it around the block, so I could listen as it went past! The resto took about 9 months to complete. It was painted Wimbledon White with Red & White interior as I preferred something other than the regular black and it went well with the exterior. One car done.

I would like to thank Robyn for her understanding and for putting up with me working 4 days on and 4 days off & and spending every spare minute in the workshop working on the coupe long after the dinner dishes have been washed up.

Phase two - Mooooooving on with my retirement looming in 2006, I felt that the Coupe was feeling lonely, so when a '65 Fastback came on the market at the right price I grabbed it. Similar to the Coupe, the Fastback was also dismantled but had been stripped to bare metal and repainted the present colour of red with white stripes and placed under a cover in 2003, it sat there for the next three years. This is still the same paint job after 15 years, I got it on the road in time to take it to Cooly in 2007.

Phase Three - Last Easter - On the way home from the Wollongong Nationals we discussed buying a new Mustang, so one of the classics had to go. Unfortunately, the Coupe lost the raffle, & it was a sad, emotional day that it was driven away, but it has gone to a lovely home, and is now lucky enough to be transporting very lucky brides on their wedding day. The "Beast" arrived on June 29, 2017, the day my Dad would have turned 100 years of age had he been still alive. We both love driving the "Beast" & it's great to have air-con, & heated/cooled seats etc.

What do you enjoy about your Mustang? It's a great car to take to car shows to show off a real piece of American classic/iconic/muscle car of the sixties era.

When and why we joined the M.O.C.A. Qld? We were in another local car club for a while and a friend asked us to join them on a Mustang Club Run, which we did, and joined shortly afterwards in about 2003, we have never looked back on that decision, as the people are friendly, and easy to get along with. We also have had a lot of variety on the runs with past and present Run Coordinators, unlike the previous car club we were in.

What do you enjoy about being in M.O.C.A. Qld? We have found that the Club has a great combination of younger and somewhat, dare I say more 'mature members', who all seem to get along as they all share a common interest with their beautiful cars. We both agree that it is important for all members to try and step up to the plate and take a small part in the running of the Club. Robyn and I were involved with the merchandising from 2006 to 2011, and I have done the Vehicle dating letters since 2008, and still enjoy it. Robyn is the current Social Director and I do the bar at the meetings. Why? Because it gives you a good feeling by giving something back to this great Club.

I would like to acknowledge a Mustang Club Legend, the late Kevin "Snowy" Bennett for the inspiration and guidance he gave me in regard to showing my car at major events (Nationals) we still miss your dry sense of humour Snow.

NEWS from OVERSEAS

High lights from British Historic Vehicle Clubs magazine:

Emission Surcharge as included in the LONDON Congestion Charge, is in force and historic vehicles are exempt from only the emission surcharge but if you check the status of historic vehicles, it suggests the vehicles are compliant with emission standards, so may cause problems in the future.

Oxford Zero Emissions Zone will prohibit any vehicles not powered by electricity from the greater Oxford area, they may exempt historic vehicles for use when filming. The Legislation Committee has this in hand and will respond when they decide what to do.

NEW YORK reintroduces, Bill for one off payment of rego for historic vehicles [25 years] of \$100.00 to replace \$28.75 each year.

CALIFORNIA is to introduce a bill to introduce legislation to require a transition to fully-electric vehicles in the state by 2040. Exemption has been made for vehicles weighing over 10,000 pounds and certain vehicles brought in from out of state. The current bill does not allow for any other exemptions for collector or hobbyist vehicles. The bill has not yet assigned to a committee for debate, the SEMA action network will monitor the bill closely.
