\$85 for New Membership between 1st July and 31st December (\$25 joining fee + \$60 annual fee)
\$55 for New Membership between 1st January and 30th June (\$25 joining fee + \$30 - 6 months fee)
Any application for membership received for a 6 month option before January will be held until January 1st for processing unless the new member wishes to pay the full year membership fee

\$60 for Annual Membership Renewal

Membership renewals are due and payable on the 1st July each year.

Should payment not be received by 31st August, those Members will be deemed "un-financial" and removed from the Club database. NATIONAL DELEGATES: Martin spoke about the Painted Silos run to Adelaide. A number of Mustangs and 5 Caravans will be making the journey. As Alan Rogers will be unable to attend the delegates meeting, Russell Whitney has been appointed as proxy. The secretary will advise the national body.

NATIONAL LOTTERY: Martin again stressed the importance of selling tickets. All sold ticket stubs and unsold books are to be back to the secretary by the next meeting at the latest. This will be **WEDNESDAY**, **25**TH **MARCH**.

The treasurer now has a new computer as the old one was not repairable. The money spent on the repairs was credited to the purchase of the new computer.

The new lease has now been signed and Ed has a building inspection with the Council tomorrow morning. We also have to do a census which is due by the 16th March.

Ed touched again on the impromptu runs and advised with the pending changes of the Website and Facebook pages – they will assist with dealing with this issue and we will need to sort out how they are used in conjunction with each other and our members

In the meantime, Sandra Whitney will continue to monitor the club facebook until the new website is up and running.

Ed mentioned that Alan had received enquiries re recommended repairers. We feel it may be helpful to construct a list of go to people for assistance with repairs and parts for your Mustangs. The list could then be accessed by "members" who can then make their own choices if they elect to use anybody on the list. Obviously, it is not current club policy as what is great for some doesn't work for others, but it may assist other members who are not able to do the repairs themselves. Ed also stated that a club disclaimer should be mentioned on the list.

Russell stated that when he received these requests in the past, he told the persons concerned to join the club and come to meetings/runs and ask members about their experiences. Russell also mentioned that we need to support those that advertise in our magazine. Ed agreed with Russell's statement and pointed out that those that are placed on the list can and will be approached to advertise in our magazine – but more to the point, those that are active members and do advertise should be supported as much as possible by club members in everything we do.

John Binge told the meeting that the next week would be the first meeting of our club 40 years ago. There were 7 members present. We have certainly grown since then.



After thanking the team at Auto One, we headed off at 7.30am for a weekend away to support of a regional community and to raise funds for a local Fire Service, within that community. Ed Callander (VP) and his co-driver Ken Clark lead the way and we were all impressed with two things – firstly Ed's driving to avoid a large kangaroo which was as tall as Ed's convertible, came out of the scrub and bounced in front of his car. The journey was delightful and very relaxing, as we cruised through the beautiful countryside of green paddocks, mountains and trees. Wonderful to see the countryside looking so good. Sheep were grazing in a paddock that reminded us of New Zealand. What an amazing difference the recent rains have made. We stopped at the BP Aratula and collected members there and our convoy continued cruising up through Cunningham's Gap, over the range. We saw where the bushfires had gone through and the devastation caused, looking down the valley and up through the mountains. We could see where the fires had crossed over the road – what was particularly pleasing, was all the regrowth happening and to hear the rain forest birds chirping, as we cruised through the range.

Onwards through to Warwick and then arrived at Stanthorpe. As we checked into our motels, we could all feel the coolness in the air – it was 18 degrees maximum for the day. There is so much more – olives, garlic, vinegar, tomatoes, chutneys, sauces, strawberries, table grapes, cheeses, even soap and ugg boot manufacturers.

The wine tour consisted of three wineries and one brewery at the end, to cleanse our taste buds after sampling at lot of different wines, both whites and reds. Firstly we visited Casley Mt Hutton Winery. Grant and Sonya were our hosts and we sampled a lot of different wines. A wonderful lunch was put on for us, made up of local produce and bread supplied from a local baker. Grant explained that the area has had 300 mls of rain and while it has certainly greened things up around the place, sadly the rain hasn't been enough to fill their supply dam and water is still being trucked in from Warwick, so the area is still on water restrictions.





On to Just Red Wines where our host Craig led us though a vast range of reds. This winery had beautiful roses at the end of each row of vines. The roses, apart from looking magnificent, also serve the purpose of detecting diseases which could invade the vines.

On to the third winery – The Twisted Gum, a small winery which is dry grown i.e. not irrigated. Our host Michelle, told us that it has been a couple of very tough years, however the recent rains have really produced very health vines. Again, beautiful roses at the end of each row of the vines – red roses for the red grape vines and white roses for the white grape vines.

Was great to see Club Members purchasing wines from these wineries and loading them in the bus. Our taste buds were a bit exhausted, so we headed to the Brass Monkey Brewery, a microbrewery with an extensive range of beers, made from local hops and barley. Just what our taste buds needed - a cleansing ale!



Back to the motels to scrub up and make our way to O'Mara's Hotel where we had an exclusive area in a cosy room, as by this time the outside temperature had dropped significantly. Again, the same wonderful local hospitality we had experienced all day, great meals and fantastic fellowship where members took the time to mingle and get to know each other better.
