Hi Everyone,


As usual there is a fair bit going on so I'm going dot point to keep it organised;






How HENRY FORD Came To The Decision To Build The V8 Engine

When Henry Ford introduced his new V8 engine in 1932 he delivered something that the experts had said was

impossible. A single casting V8 engine in a car at a price that the general public could afford. Although the correct name is an L-Head engine, the Ford Flathead made news and was an instant hit when it was introduced to the public on March 31st 1932. All V8 engines that have appeared in competitors' products since Ford introduced his V8 engine were made in response to the Ford marketing challenge.

The fact is, the Ford Flathead V8 is enjoying something of a resurgence in popularity these days with the hot rod magazines devoting quite a bit of press to them. This is remarkable considering that the last US built Flathead Ford V8 was built in 1953. Over 60 years ago! Why the interest?


The engine is simple in construction when compared to modern engines, parts are still plentiful and relatively easy to find. In addition, many per-




formance parts makers such as Eddlebrock and Offenhauser still make parts for this venerable engine. Even superchargers are still available for the Ford Flathead V8! You can really make this engine perform, and to top it off, most of the standard engine parts are still available.

Why did Henry Ford introduce a V8 engine at the height of the Depression? Very simple, Henry was losing sales to Chevrolet. Chevrolet had introduced a six cylinder engine and was selling more cars as a result. Henry Ford didn't like six cylinder engines. In his early attempts at building a six, he came upon what appeared to be insurmountable problems. The crankshafts were long and prone to breaking. As a result old Henry swore that he'd never build another six cylinder engine (he eventually did, but only at the insistence of his son Edsel.) Ford's reasoning was that if he did match Chevrolet's six with a Ford designed six, he would be an industry follower and not a leader. So Ford tasked his engineers with designing and building a reasonably priced V8 engine.




