





Inquiry into Motor Recreational Activities

Terms of Reference

On Monday 21 October 2019 the Transport and Public Works Committee resolved to inquire into and report to the Legislative Assembly on the contribution of the motor recreational activities (MRA) to Queensland, and in doing so look at the volume and range of MRAs currently practiced by and available to the people of Queensland.

Some of the Motor Recreational Activities currently enjoyed by Queenslanders are:

Recreational flying.
Engine powered models - including boats, aircraft, cars and now drone racing.
Social or Marque car clubs - there are at least 183 registered car clubs in SEQ estimated to service more
than 150,000 members.
Competitive car clubs - these are venue based, known as Speedway, Drags and Circuit (including go-kart-
ing), and non-venue based, such as rallying.
Circuit racing and historical motorcycle clubs.
Recreational and charity ride days.
Dirt motorcycle or motor cross clubs.

In undertaking this inquiry, the Committee should consider:

- a. The economic impact of the motor recreation industry to Queensland, including opportunities to grow the industry to create jobs for Queenslanders;
- b. The contribution of the industry to Queensland's tourism sector and opportunities to grow Queensland's share of the motor recreation tourism market;
- c. The legislative, regulatory and policy framework in which the industry operates in all levels of government, and options for reform;
- d. Options to improve the safety of all industry participants;
- e. The impact on youth training and community engagement from motor recreational activities, including mental health outcomes;
- f. The impact of the industry on road safety outcomes;
- g. Challenges facing the industry and the role of government in supporting the industry to continue creating jobs for Queenslanders;
- h. Other issues that arise as agreed upon by the Committee.

Article on Research being carried out by Tony Kilvington from SA printed in the MUSTANG SA in May 2019.

I have been undertaking some research on Mustangs that were imported to Australia in 1966 and converted to RHD by Ford Australia for the local market. My investigations have taken me to Colin Falso (MOCA VIC) who has been trying to identify these vehicles for years and through his Facebook page (refer link below) has been able to make contact with numerous people who have owned an Australian converted Mustang from that program and accordingly Colin has commenced a registry.

Colin advises that of the 209 Mustangs that were part of the official Ford Australia Import Program, 48 were 1965 Hardtops and 161 were 1966 Hardtops all beginning life as conventional Metuchen-built and serialized export cars before being shipped, fully assembled, to Australia, where they were converted and renumbered.

For instance, the VIN <u>6T07C165347</u> which was a 1966 Hardtop, Wimbledon White exterior, Red interior, 289-2V, C4-Automatic and Axle 2.80:1 open rear, assembled on 6 December 1965, was shipped "down under" to become <u>AA07FY65347</u> in February 1966. The breakdown of the code is:

A = Product source region - Australia

A = Assembly Plant – Homebush Aust

07 = Body Type - Coupe/Hardtop

F = 1966

Y = February

65347 = Last 5 digits of the production unit number off the assembly line

A plate was installed on the right (now the driver's side) door sill declaring the vehicles "Made by Ford Australia", and another "Australian Compliance Plate" was affixed to the firewall.

No other body style was part of the official Ford Australia Import program for the launch of the V8 XR Falcon. However, there were other body styles and hardtops imported and converted to RHD by either Ford or sub-contractors but they were special imports by dealers/for Ford executives etc.

All the Mustangs imported under this program had a VIN that commenced with "5T07" and "6T07" with the DSO code of 90 – EXPORT.

A sample of the information we have found is as follows:

(C-code 289-2v, C-4 Auto Transmission, Axle 2:80-1, DSO 95, Owner reported as Barry Brown Australia – Barry and Ruth Brown are current SA members)

(C-code 289-2v, C-4 Auto Transmission, Axle 2:80-1, DSO 95, Owner reported as John Nixon Australia – QLD member)

AA07FY75316 / 6T07C175316

(C-code 289-2v, C-4 Auto Transmission, Axle 2:80-1, DSO 95, Owner reported as Colleen Lucas Melville Australia – WA member)

AA07FY75330 / 6T07C175330

(C-code 289-2v, C-4 Auto Transmission, Axle 2:80-1, DSO 95, Owner reported as Denis Dequara Australia)

So what I am doing at the minute is to extend the data we have on all Mustangs in the Club and I will be seeking your data plate or label from your Mustang to update Club records to identify Australian built Mustangs for Colin's registry and for future reference when the story of Mustangs across Australia is written. If you are not sure whether I have your data plate details on record, take a pic of the plate/label on the edge of the left hand door and SMS to me on 0401 123 931 or email tony.kilvington@gmail.com as it will be greatly appreciated.




