The committee thanks all office bearers and other club members for their efforts throughout the year.

Overview

- The key register has been maintained, updated and signed by all parties holding club keys.
- The clubhouse lease agreement with Brisbane City Council has two (2) years remaining.
- The only regular sub-lets of the clubhouse are to the Sprite Car Club (monthly) and the XR Falcon Club (once annually). A local choir uses the building irregularly as a rehearsal space.
- Club operations have continued with no major changes. We have adopted a mission statement as a touchstone and have generally freed up a few of the operational constraints that might

have made the Club seem a little 'mean' to some people. We try to be responsibly generous and hope that some of the incorrect perceptions will change over time.

- The Club's financial returns have been prepared and/or checked by David Star (Tax Agent) and John Dixon (Accountant/Auditor) as for previous years. The Club's financial position remains strong and there were no matters brought to the committee's attention by the auditor.
- The procedure for recognizing 20 and 30 year members was changed this year. These loyal members are recognized individually on the month of their milestone anniversary rather than all together at the AGM.

Financials

Total asset value at 30 June 2018 was \$119,559, compared to \$116,085 at 30 June 2017. The Club incurred a tax bill of \$1,281 for the 2016-17 FY. Generally, income from members is not taxable but income from non-members is taxable unless it can be offset by expenses, so this unexpectedly large bill was due to early payment by sponsors and vendors for the 2017 Concours. Taxation provision for 2017-18 is \$133. The fully audited financial report is available for perusal and a summary will be published along with this report in the October 2018 Club Magazine. The 2017-18 Tax Assessment has not yet been received, therefore the Club's tax situation is only an estimate provided by the auditor.

Expenditure

The committee ensured all required expenses were paid and the Club got the best possible value for money. No work was done to the clubhouse in this reporting period because there was nothing that needed attention. This will change in coming years with bigger maintenance items, coming due. Printing and mailing of the magazine remains the Club's largest recurring expense.

Membership

Membership on 30th June 2018 was 366, five (5) members more than the same time last year.

Major Events

The Hot Wheels and Cool Classics Car Show, incorporating the MOCA QLD INC State Concours was held on 10th September 2017 at Logan River Parklands. This was an excellent event with a very good venue and great support from sponsors, vendors, members and the general public leading to a profit of approximately \$11,000 spread across the 2016-17 and 2017-18 financial years. This was an outstanding effort by the Concours Committee and by all the other club members who donated time, services or pitched in to help. The next major event will be the 2019 State Concours.

Charitable Donations

We donated \$5,000 to Autism QLD from the proceeds of our 2017 Concours. We must have a charitable purpose as a not-for-profit. We prefer to donate things that are needed rather than money, particularly

where overheads will dilute the effect of the donation, but sometimes money is the best donation option available to the Club.

<u>Club Runs</u>

Neil De San Miguel (Run and Events Coordinator) has done a great job getting us out to a variety of interesting destinations, ably assisted by members who have organized some runs during the year. Particular mention to Les Nye for arranging the mid-month mid-week runs. The Club sanctioned runs and events are great opportunities for members to give their cars some exercise amongst friends.

Club Meetings

Most meetings are attended by 35-40 members. The members who attend most meetings form the operational 'core' of the Club, filling the elected positions to keep the Club running.

Merchandising

Yolande Holst took over the merchandising this year. The decision to include merchandise on the membership application form by a previous committee continues to pay off with strong sales to new members as part of their joining 'package'. There have been a couple of product/design changes driven by product availability but otherwise business as usual.

Magazine / Website

The monthly printing and mailing costs are now about as low as we can make them without compromising quality or delivery. We now print and mail just over 100 copies per month which is a bit of an economical sweet spot. The unit cost goes up if we dip below 100/month so further cost reductions are unlikely. The Magazine Editor (Robyn Messenger) has done a great job running the public faces of the Club (Website & Magazine) to keep the members informed and to make us look good to prospective members.

Club Person of the Year – 2017

Chris Holst earned this award. This award is points-based with points awarded for participation in club activities. Chris was just ahead of the field in 2017. The 2018 Club Person of the Year will be announced at the January 2019 meeting.

During the course of this year's audit, we found the current system seems to be working reasonably well. As part of a program of continuous improvement of the records and internal controls of your activities, we wish to report the following matters arising from the audit:

1. Material audit adjustments

No material audit adjustments were identified/carried out during our Audit

2. Matters for the Committee's attention

In the course of our audit, we did not detect any issues to bring to your attention

3. Further matters for your review

We did not identify any significant administration issues in the conduct of our Audit; however, we would recommend that each month when the bank reconciliation is completed and presented to the committee a copy of the bank statement should be attached as verification of the balance.

Overall, we'd like to commend the Treasurer on the accuracy and presentation of the records.

This report is prepared on the basis of the limitations set out below.

The matters raised in this report are only those that came to our attention during the course of our audit and are not necessarily a comprehensive statement of all the weaknesses that exist or improvements that might be made.

We cannot, in practice, examine every activity and procedure, nor can we be a substitute for management's responsibility to maintain adequate controls over all levels of operations and their responsibility to prevent and detect irregularities, including fraud.

Accordingly, management should not rely on our report to identify all weaknesses that may exist in the systems and procedures reviewed, or potential instances of fraud that may exist. Our comments should be read in the context of the scope of our work. Findings within this report may have been prepared on the basis of management representations.

We were Privileged

We were privileged to have been invited to attend a "MY18 Mustang Track Experience" at Lakeside Raceway on Friday 5th October with 12 other fortunate participants.



We arrived at Lakeside and were greeted by Rachel Simpson from Ford Australia, event staff and the professional drivers who were to take us through a driving experience we will never forget. After a sumptuous lunch, we were introduced to the MY18 convertible and shown the unique features of the 2018 model. The MY18 is a sleeker design with more advanced technology and greater performance than previous models. The 2018 model features an all LCD electronic dash which is able to be customised to your preferences. The list of customisations available is extensive but includes taco, speedo and engine management/transmission gauges. In "Drag mode", the "Christmas tree" appears on the dash with descending lights to the countdown - perfect for the 0 to 100!

We were educated on the correct placement of our hands on the steering wheel and the usual 10 and 2 position we all grew up with has now been replaced with 9 and 3 as a more comfortable and responsive steering position. We were advised not to grip the steering wheel and place our thumbs just resting on the steering wheel above the controls. The driver's arms should be at 90 degrees to the steering wheel, which allows the driver to feel more relaxed but in control and able to respond much faster to any driving situation.

Ford has listened to feedback from existing Mustang owners and has responded with the improvement of many features in the MY18. Existing Mustang owners asked for the exhaust to

be more pronounced and Ford have included an active exhaust valve with four choices of exhaust modes. This should be well received by new owners, as we all like to hear the sound of a beast.

The new smooth bonnet shape has been improved to reduce injuries should a driver have the unfortunate experience of colliding with a pedestrian. The old school bonnet support rod continues to be a feature. This allows for the rear bonnet hinges to "pop" upon impact, allowing the bonnet to become a softer surface should an impact occur with a pedestrian.

The MY18 also includes one of our favourite features - AEB – "Autonomous Emergency Braking", designed to detect if the car in front has unexpectedly stopped or a pedestrian steps out on the road and can automatically apply the brakes if you don't.

The new 10 speed automatic select shift transmission is the best automatic transmission in any Mustang ever. The powerful 5.0L V8 engine utilises a dual-fuel, high pressure direct injection and low-pressure port injection system. This translates to 339kW3 of power and 556Nm3 of torque.

The Ford "MyKey" feature continues from the earlier models and enables the owner to personalise/disable functions for other drivers or valets, which gives the owner peace of mind when they are not at the wheel.



After discussing the many new features of the MY18, we were given the opportunity to take the 2018's for a run around the track. Ford supplied seven MY18 Mustangs for us to play with for the afternoon. We noticed the improved stability control in the MY18 with the "MagneRide" suspension kit (\$6000 optional extra) and had the pleasure of taking them through their paces under driver instruction. We learned how to handle the vehicle at high speed through the track and were free to let the pony loose. Most of us clocked speeds nearing 200kms per hour with coaching from the professional driver in the passenger seat.

We all tried the new "drag mode", and I don't mean wearing a dress - waiting on the start line for the "Christmas Tree" on the dash to count down to green and "Floor it". The average results were .6 of a second reaction time and 5 seconds to reach 100 kms per hour. Not a bad result for amateur drivers.

The finale was a "Hot lap" with a professional driver in the driver's seat where we reached speeds in excess of 220kms per hour. This gave us a great respect for racing car drivers and the skills required to achieve these speeds. We had no idea that a standard car "off the showroom floor" (with the "MagneRide") was capable of such a great performance during these "hot laps".

Anyone who is lucky enough to purchase an MY18 will surely come away with a smile on their face. We thoroughly enjoyed our experience and although we own a 2017, we were very impressed with the 2018 improved features and performance.



A Visit to Fort Myers

If you ever go to southwest Florida, you should try to include a visit to The Edison and Ford Winter Estates in Fort Myers. (You will of course drive there in your rented convertible Mustang). I went there last October with some friends who live nearby.

The inventor Thomas Edison built a winter home on the shores of the Caloosahatchee River in 1885 and his friend Henry Ford became his next-door neighbor in 1916.

Henry Ford's home was used for just a few weeks each year

Edison established a laboratory across the road from his house and today this houses an excellent museum. Like Edison, Ford was a prolific inventor and the V8 engine is credited to him.








Henry Ford had a vested interest in receiving an adequate supply of road tyres and was concerned about potential disruptions to the supply of rubber. The pair experimented with growing various species of trees in their grounds to see if rubber could be produced locally but after much effort this proved to be unsuccessful.
