The restaurant did a fantastic job in cooking an assortment of pre ordered delicious meals for us.





## 'GRACE'

'Grace' is finally home. Dawnie and I look forward to many days of fun cruising and attending a few car shows. A boyhood dream realised!!! For those who know their Mustangs, she is a 66 K code coupe and auto. A very rare car indeed. Just as she came out of the factory.

I remember when Dr Charles Matusek imported probably the first Mustang into Hobart. He had a surgery off Davey St next to St John's church. Every time we drove by, I would look to see if the red 'Stang was there. Sometimes it was there when I went to church on Sundays. I would stand and drool. I was in love with Don Elliot's Mustang that Robin Pare raced at Baskerville. I saw it race at Symons Plains and Longford too.

Owning one was a boyhood dream that was never going to become a reality at any level. In 2006 I bought the XP for \$1000 as a kind of compromise. But it still wasn't a Mustang. As I drew closer to retirement my updated dream was to purchase one as a play car. Again, it seemed a great idea but unlikely.

A dedicated Kiwi car collector from our church told me about a K Code Mustang he was looking at in America. I thought his idea of buying one sight unseen was folly and told him so. He proceeded, and I tracked its progress into the country very carefully. It arrived in Australia and I was amazed to find it was as he described it. A 1966 Ford Mustang K Code coupe auto with the HiPo engine and all the gear in Wimbledon white. It was still as it came from the factory with the AM radio, drum brakes, C4 auto, fake wire wheel hubcaps and red walled cross-ply tyres. It was in mint condition. It had been winning car shows in America in the 90's.

Having seen it at a car show, I highly desired that car. Firstly, I knew it wasn't for sale and secondly that it would be well out of my price range.

With a change in life circumstances, I decided I probably would go ahead and buy a Mustang. Dawnie is a car lover and is closely involved in our racing pursuits with the XP. When we discussed it, she said, "You know you want to"! We decided to look for a coupe. Why the coupe? Well, I guess that is what I remember as a teenager and holds most relevance to me. At the top of the list was a K Code. After all, they are the most sought after and collectable version available. I scoured the country, being too frightened to import one from the USA given the pitfalls. As usual, there were none available. I thought my chances of acquiring one were pretty slim.

Three years after Lewis imported this one, I gave him a call. "Well I guess I have no need for two Mustangs", was the reply. He already has a black and gold 1966 Shelby 350 clone. A few more emails, a test run, up on the hoist and the deal was done. The K Code, or 'Grace' as we call her, has taken up residence with the XP Falcon. <u>Does that mean we are now collectors?</u>






