\$85 for New Membership between 1st July and 31st December (\$25 joining fee + \$60 annual fee)
\$55 for New Membership between 1st January and 30th June (\$25 joining fee + \$30 - 6 months fee)
Any application for membership received for a 6 month option before January will be held until January 1st for processing unless the new member wishes to pay the full year membership fee

Proposal to Change the MOCA Monthly Club Run Date

The vote on this issue at the January 2018 meeting is intended to enable us to move forward, putting this brief disruption behind us and getting on with promoting and enjoying our Club, our cars and the friendships we have made. We will respect and enact the majority decision.

The proposal will be; that we change the monthly club run date from the first Sunday to the third Sunday of each month. Once this motion is moved and seconded, all members present will be asked to vote by a show of hands as usual.

The voting format for this issue/proposal has changed based on discussions and input from members at the November meeting. This is not a constitutional change so it does not require a postal vote to include all members. It is a proposal that will affect quite a few members who do not always attend the monthly meetings, so the vote has been held over until January to afford these members the opportunity to attend the meeting or to proxy vote by email. Emails shall be sent to a committee member no later than 17 January 2018, one week before the meeting, so they can be collated and tallied. Emails received after the cut-off will not be counted. The email proxy votes will be added to the show of hands result but will not be shown or discussed before the show of hands.

Points for the Proposal:

- 1. Changing the date of the MOCA(Qld) Inc. monthly club run will allow those who are also financial members of the Pony Car Club to attend most runs conducted by both clubs.
- 2. Changing the run date may increase MOCA membership by encouraging more 'dual members' from the Pony Car Club.
- 3. The September run would no longer conflict with some family commitments on Father's Day, likewise the October run would not be on a long weekend.

Points against the Proposal:

- 1. MOCA and the Pony Car Club are not affiliated in any way and follow different Constitutional Rules including Objectives. We should consider the objectives and members of our club ahead of other clubs and their membership.
- 2. Changing the club run date was proposed at the Annual General Meeting of the Pony Car Club approximately 4 to 5 years ago. The proposal was voted on at that meeting and was solidly defeated.
- 3. MOCA club runs have been on the first Sunday for 30+ years. Why dispense with a tradition that remains popular and still works well? A good example is the Fathers Day Run on the first Sunday in September. This is usually one of our biggest runs, often attracting 80 to 100 members.
- 4. There are approximately a dozen members (plus partners) who are members of both MOCA and the Pony Car Club. It is a group of these members who are most interested to change the MOCA run date.
- 5. If we change from the first Sunday it may impact on some of our members who might also be members of other clubs that use the third Sunday as their run day. Changing to suit some may disadvantage others.

An example overheard at a recent Club meeting:



Joyce revs up bid to axe tariff on imported cars

THE Federal Government has opened the door to axing the tariff on imported new cars amid mounting calls for action on Australia's road toll.

Peak motoring and road safety groups argue that the 5 per cent import tariff and the Luxury Car Tax, originally designed to protect the domestic car industry, are redundant now Ford, Toyota and Holden have stopped manufacturing in Australia.

The Australian Automobile Association has called on the Government to scrap both in this year's Budget to encourage drivers to buy new cars with better safety features.

Budget documents show

the Government expects to make \$2 billion in revenue over the forward estimates from the import tax alone, but Deputy Prime Minister Barnaby Joyce yesterday said scrapping the tariff was "an idea of merit".

"It requires discussions with Cabinet and discussions with the expenditure review committee but it does have merit," he told ABC radio.

The admission comes amid growing calls for action on Australia's shocking road toll after a series of fatal crashes over the Christmas and New Year period.


