RUN REPORT: Neil reported on the recent run to Caloundra RSL. It was a good turn out and good run up, although the traffic coming home was congested. The Christmas party is this weekend. It is too late if you haven't already booked. Lakeside is on 27th November, after Christmas party. December 4th is the Shannon's rum distillery run. The back gate to a secure car park will be open for our use. Our tour is at 10.30am for \$10 or for an extra \$5 you can include a sample. Lunch will be at Windaroo Golf club. Neil will send out an email to all attendees for the Shannon's distillery run with full details and lunch particulars. January 7th which is a Saturday is the fish and chip run to Bribie Island. MAGAZINE REPORT: Robyn Messenger –nothing to report. Alan Messenger–explained that the magazine costs a lot of money to print and post and some members prefer to read a hard copy instead of a copy on their computer. He explained how we could reduce the cost of printing and postage to the members who request a hard copy, if we halve the hard copies produced by posting out a copy every second month and members receive an emailed version the other 6 month. Or we could post 4 hard copies per year and the rest of the year email a copy to members. This will reduce the cost of printing and may provide the opportunity to have more colour or more pages. Les asked what does it cost to produce the magazine. Chris said approximately \$700 per month, which is \$5 per month per member including postage. It is the club's biggest reoccurring cost - magazine postage is \$300 per month. Russell Whitney stated that for members who are computer illiterate, they will not like the reduction in hard copies. Also, the cost of printing may increase if we reduce the number of copies printed. Chris suggested that management can discuss this further.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

Les - Mid month runs will be starting in 2017. February run will be to Mermaids on the beach at Deception Bay. March run to Mt Cotton cafe where there is a boomerang boardwalk with views to the city. April run to Songbirds at Mt Tamborine. May run to Cafe at Lake Moogerah.



Chris -Discussed a proposal to hold an intra-club swap meet in March 2017 and/or a larger all welcome swap meet in conjunction with the concourse in September 2017 and proposed to vote on the 2 alternatives. Ray Law suggested we could do both and leave the vote till a later date for more consideration. Marice -read an email from Harry Ockers with a request for assistance - "I have a 1970 Mustang Fast back. I am having problems with headers at the moment. I have just spent 5 yrs on rebuild I have installed a 5ltr xr8 sprint engine out of a 92 EB. The problem is the headers are hitting the solenoid on the starter motor. I got the headers from Roadstar Sydney they are series1 clipster. Have any of your members had the same problem. If so could you give me some advice on how to get over this problem."

A suggested fix was to change the starter motor to a high torque starter motor.

Russ Beavis – stated his car was on full rego but wondered if he was covered if he takes someone for a drive to a prom. He spoke to Dept of Transport and they stated that taking a direct family member is ok, and other relatives was a grey area, provided there was no payment. Chris replied – not my area of expertise, but if the car is on full rego, you can drive anywhere and with anyone as long as it was not for hire or reward. The Dept of Transport rule applies to cars on SIVS rego only. Russell Whitney – if on full rego, you can carry anyone anywhere, but he warned that if you have an accident and the person/s you take in the car are injured, they have the option to sue. Chris -reminded members that one of our club members "East Coast Muscle Car Hire" who advertises in the club magazine, has a licence to hire cars.

Delegates Report November 2016

This is a follow up of Towing in NSW which I mentioned in a report earlier in the year.

This is taken from an article by Graham Allum in RESTORED CARS Australia and printed with his permission

NSW TOWING REGS

A friend of mine had the opportunity to put some questions to the Senior Investigations Officer, Tow Truck Investigation Unit NSW RMS regarding the towing Laws as published in this column.

The answers are as follows.

To Prosecute RMS needs to prove all of the following-

What is happening is actually a tow as per the regulations.

The vehicle is a tow truck and a Motor Vehicle as per the regulations.

AND the tow is for business.

If you want, you can look up those definitions on the RMS web site.

The leading question was then does the Act apply to private people moving their own vehicles?

"The Act only applies to the towing industry."

I am told the following clearly states that this does not apply to private people.

"Application of the Act.

- Except to the extant provided by subsection (2), this Act does not apply to or in respect of a tow truck operated by the Crown or a statutory body representing the Crown.
- (2) This Act applies to persons (other than employees of the Crown or of a statutory representing the Crown) who carry out tow truck operations under a contract or arrangement made or entered into with the Crown or statutory body representing the Crown."

So, there you have it, apparently, that quite clearly states that this does not apply to private individuals.

Now while this exempts private people using privately registered tow vehicles if you are using a commercial (non-NSW registered) tow vehicle, (tow truck or tilt tray) you would be in breach, even if the "tow Job" is for private use.

Other questions answered were -

A private person picking up a car in NSW that he has bought? *No Problem*.

Someone hires a trailer to collect a car from NSW? *No Problem.*

Taking a car into NSW and then returning it home? *No Problem.*

Someone who owns a truck (could be a tow truck or tilt tray) that is used only to transport his own cars. No Problem, however if the person was a wrecker or dealer, etc and uses the truck as part of a business operation to move vehicles he has acquired, this would be an issue. In other words, if the tow vehicle is privately registered then no problem but if it is commercially registered then there would be a problem.

Someone picking up a car in NSW for someone else. How would this be regarded? If it is just a mate picking up a car for someone and the person is just paying for petrol, for example, it would be no problem. Again, this would depend on the registration of the tow vehicle.

Could an out of state person be stopped and questioned about towing another vehicle in NSW? Yes. RMS inspectors have the authority to do this. They have a series of questions they use to determine if someone should be operating under a towing licence. These (questions) would include where the person is coming from and where the load is being taken. This is simply to determine if the person is operating an un-licenced towing business.

This applies to moving a vehicle through NSW.

Ford Sells Mustang Number One!



Mustang Number One (VIN 5F08F100001), a convertible, was accidentally sold when it was brand-new. Ford intended to truck the car across Canada on a tour of dealerships. However, a salesman in St. Johns, Newfoundland, accidentally sold it to airline pilot Captain Stanley Tucker. He drove it about 10,000 miles and then traded it back to Ford. In fact, he traded up for the 1,000,001 Mustang built. A '66 model assembled at Dearborn, Michigan, on March 2, 1966. Today, 5F08F100001 is on display in the Henry Ford Museum in Dearborn.


