Welcome to the September Magazine


We parked up at Scotties and relaxed under a huge tree and with the Covid 19 codes in place enjoyed a lazy social morning.

#### **CURFEW**


THE WORD "CURFEW" COMES FROM THE FRENCH PHRASE "COUVRE-FEU", WHICH MEANS "COVER THE FIRE". IT WAS USED TO DESCRIBE THE TIME OF BLOWING OUT ALL LAMPS AND CANDLES.IT WAS LATER ADOPTED BY MIDDLE ENGLISH AS "CURFEU", WHICH LATER BECAME THE MODERN "CURFEW". IN THE EARLY AMERICAN COLONIES HOMES HAD NO REAL FIREPLACES SO A FIRE WAS BUILT IN THE CENTER OF THE ROOM. IN ORDER TO MAKE SURE A FIRE DID NOT GET OUT OF CONTROL DURING THE NIGHT IT WAS REQUIRED THAT, BY AN AGREED TIME, ALL FIRES WOLD BE COVERED WITH A CLAY POT CALLED A "CURFEW"

#### BARRELS OF OIL

When the first oil wells were drilled they had made no provision for storing the liquid so they used water barrels. That is why, to this day, we speak of barrels of oil bather than gallons










# LOOKING BACK: IACOCCA INTERVIEW

An in-depth talk from 2004 with the American automotive icon who brought us Mustang

**Editor's Note:** As the Mustang community prepared to celebrate the Mustang's 40th anniversary back in 2004, Mustang journalist/historian Jim Smart visited Lee lacocca for an interview from the man who rarely gave interviews. The result was one of the few interviews he granted that centered specifically on his involvement with the Mustang. We asked Jim to revisit the interview for *Mustang Times*.



e lost Lee Iacocca, 94, last July to natural causes. He lived a long and productive life, leaving a lasting impression, not only for his accomplishments in the car industry but also for diabe-

tes research and restoration of the Statue of Liberty. It is impossible to think of Lido Anthony "Lee" Iacocca without thinking about the Mustang.

Mustang historian Bob Fria and I met with Iacocca at his Belair, California, home in 2004 for a two-hour visit and insight into how he was feeling at age 79. Sitting across a massive library from Mr. Iacocca was surreal. He still had a very commanding presence. Lee spoke in his native Allentown accent and a strong Italian demeanor. He conversed with us as though we had been friends for a lifetime. He appreciated our passion for the vision he spun into an American icon nearly a half-century earlier.

In 2004, Ford was about to launch an all-new Mustang for 2005, one that resembled the Mustang that Iacocca launched in 1964. Lee admitted that Ford did a good job on the redesign, which helped us segue into an enlightening interview.

# JS: Did you ever think the Mustang would be so well received this many years later?

lacocca: It is remarkable. Amazing. Lasting power. You just can't predict a phenomena like that. Sometimes, great brand names go away. Heck, even great companies go away. When I was at Chrysler, we bought a great brand name—Jeep. Who knew that SUVs would be selling at 4.5 million units a year? All we had at the time was Jeep Cherokee, then we introduced the Grand Cherokee. You hit a big wave by mistake sometimes. The Mustang was something different.

#### JS: Where did the idea for a sporty, affordable compact car come from?

lacocca: To be honest, it was the Baby Boomers coming of age. The oldest Baby Boomers were 18 at the time and getting their driver's licenses. For a kid, 16, getting a new Mustang for a gift would be like going to heaven. They'd have to be a rich kid (laughs). It was a great car for its time. However, people forget that the Mustang was a do-it-yourself hardtop, convertible, or fastback. The car was \$2,368 FOB Detroit plus freight. Our goal was one dollar a pound at \$2,000 and the bean counters said we were crazy. It had carpet and full wheel covers. What excited us during our research was we would ask people what they would pay for the car without knowing the brand name. For the Mustang, they would come in at more than \$1,000 more than our figures.



#### JS: Although the base sticker price for the new Mustang was \$2,368, how many buyers actually spent that amount?

**lacocca:** The first 500,000 units sold for an average of \$3,500, considerably more than the base sticker price. Buyers loaded them up with options because they were so affordable. We planned Mustang off the Falcon chassis, of course, which was already done and paid for. We also had the engines, suspension, and chassis, which were also paid for.

#### JS: Aside from its runaway success, how did you personally feel about the Mustang?

lacocca: Mechanically, the Mustang was not a great car. However, it had the great 289 V8—the "hot one." Everyone wanted V8s and couldn't get them. We were rolling 50-60 percent of Mustangs out the door with sixes because we couldn't meet the demand for V8s.

#### JS: So the \$2,368 sticker price was the hook?

lacocca: That's right. It was a love affair. How do you describe it? You can plan... I mean, when timing overtakes you, it's luck. Remember, this was the spring of 1964. Just a few months ear-

lier in the fall of 1963, President Kennedy was killed. We had the World's Fair planned for the Mustang's introduction on opening day, April 17. Where else could you introduce a new car at a world-class event—the New York World's Fair—on opening day? The Ford exhibit at Walt Disney's Magic Skyway was beautiful. We featured the Mustang corral and it was unbelievable. Walt Disney was there. Henry Ford II was there. The biggest thing that spring was President Johnson's huge tax cut. You talk about the stars being aligned. Everything was right.

#### JS: How did such a huge unexpected demand for new Mustangs affect Ford Motor Company?

lacocca: We looked at that when we were going to be at the World's Fair with this huge exhibit. The plan was to have production going by early March and we barely made it. Dealers got one Mustang each at first.


#### JS: Automakers brag today about how quickly they can get a car to market, but look at the technology you didn't have in the early 1960s yet you got the Mustang to market auickly.

lacocca: Based on our research, we knew we had a hot car. I mean, it was Mustang mania! People broke down doors to see it. They went crazy. And J. Walter Thompson (Ford's ad agency) did one hell of a marketing effort. Very simple. I like it even to this day. You opened up a magazine and across two pages was what we called the Mona Lisa look-a two-door Mustang hardtop, full profile. All it said was, "The Unexpected...\$2,368 FOB Detroit." People got so caught up in it. Walter Murphy, our public relations guy, hoodwinked everybody figuring out how to get me on the covers of *Time* and *Newsweek* the same day with the Mustang. It was unthinkable then. These magazines were competitors. They didn't like having the same thing on the newsstand at the same time. They tried to scoop each other. Of course, Murphy lied by promising each of them an exclusive. Who knows? That might have been worth 100,000 cars! I'd like to be able to take credit for a lot of it, but we were simply overrun by all of these great events happening at the same time.

#### JS: Great timing, wasn't it?

lacocca: Well, we followed the Kennedy assassination by only six months. The nation needed a lift. It was springtime with the World's Fair and a heady time for me. We started that thing called "19641/2" because we were introducing it midyear as a 1965 model. That had never been done before in the auto industry. We always introduced new models in the fourth quarter in the fall.

#### Is your Classic Mustang Losing Power??

Well the problem could be fuel starvation caused by a degraded fuel hose at the joins between the tank and the underbody line or any of the other rubber hose joints on the way to the carby. There are at least two and three on some models. An important point to bear in mind, these hoses over time become hard and brittle and when in this state start to weep fuel and can crack with disastrous results.

I will tell you a story about the photo below. It is of the fuel pipe on one of my Mustangs that had been recently imported. The car was a red 65 coupe in very nice condition, it started easily, ran well and drove OK in normal traffic, so to show it off I decided to take it on a club run to Mt Mee. All when well until we were on the D'Aguilar highway on the hill after the Bracalba Quarry the car was under full power, near the top of the grade the engine started to miss, I backed off and the engine returned to normal, I then carried on to the meet point at the D'Aguilar Hotel. We left the hotel as a group heading up Mt Mee for the picnic area at the top of the mountain. Well, about a third of the way up the engine started to miss eventually cutting out altogether. I stopped on the side of the road and managed to restart the engine and tried to carry on up the hill only to have the engine stop again. At that stage I decide to call it a day and managed to get home without a problem, it was basically all downhill.

During the next week I stripped and rebuilt the carby, then the fuel pump, plus I fully tested the ignition system, all good. So, I took the car for another test run on the flat no problems but when I tried a long hill that required more power, the engine again missed and stopped. As I was sure the engine end was OK, that only left the fuel delivery system from the fuel tank to check out maybe a flattened steel fuel line?? That's when I found the kinked hose between the tank and body fuel line. I also discovered the hose was rock hard no flex at all and starting to crack, as were the other rubber hoses in the line, they were all original hoses. I replaced all the hoses then went for another test drive, success, the car now powered up hills.

As a result of this experience I strongly recommend that rubber hoses on fuel lines are changed at least every 10 years or immediately you get a Classic Mustang.
