



Should you use an Engine Cleaning Additive?



The short answer is NO.

It has been said that older engines that have been in service for a long period, need an internal clean. The only people who say that are the people who sell engine cleaning products. The problem with commercial engine cleaners is that they are chemically aggressive and can strip critical additive films off components, leading to increased engine wear and damage. These additive films are important, in fact vital, as they ensure the engine is protected on start-up during this period when lubrication relies solely on the additive film just before the oil film is sufficiently thick to support the load.

There are several deposits that can be found in an engine, and these are caused by neglecting oil changes and not running the engine at full power from time to time. These are ash, soot and varnish; the latter two are the result of the oil oxidizing due to age and heat. Most newer engine oils are formulated with a lower ash content to meet the latest environmental emission standards and have an increased level of antioxidant to allow longer oil change periods. This lower ash content coupled with the lower sulphur content in current fuels has greatly reduced the tendency for ash to build up in the exhaust train. **But** unfortunately, these newer oils cannot be used in the older style engines used in classic Mustangs.

The ash or soot problem is exacerbated, if the oil is allowed to remain in service beyond its usable service life, ash build-up, especially on valves, is still possible. A further problem that can occur when the oil is left in the engine beyond the recommend change period, it can begin to turn more acidic and lead to corrosive damage as well as ash build-up.

Engine cleaners may also have adverse effects on the oil, such as lowering the viscosity and neutralizing additives. A better strategy would be to clean up the carbon sediment, varnish, and ash by giving the engine a good hard run, as Bill Crosby said "clean out the pipes" then carry out a series of short oil changes and hard runs to allow the detergents in the oil to clean the engine over time and engine operation at full power to burn the soot and ash out of the exhaust system.

I realise that this article was a little specialised, but I have been asked the question by several members, so you have my views.
