**APPOINTMENT OF CLUB SECRETARY:** David Lewis was nominated for the position of Secretary and was voted into the position unanimously.

## PRESENTATION OF 20 YEAR CLUB MEMBERSHIP BADGES:

Congratulations to David and Carolyn Irving on achieving 20 years membership of MOCA. 20-year membership badges were present by Club President Ed Callander.

**CLUB MEMBER OF THE YEAR ANNOUNCED:** Congratulations to Alan Messenger. President Ed Callander presented the trophy and advised it was a very close race and came down to a couple of points between 3 people. Alan carried the club through Covid and held it in good stead and was a deserving winner.

#### MINUTES OF APRIL MEETING

**Moved:** David Irving **2**nd: Neil de San Miguel

**BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES:** Nil issues. Ed provided a report from John Delany on the roof of the club rooms. As discussed at last meeting he was unsure of the condition of the roof as there was evidence of rust on the flashings. After getting it inspected, he was advised by John to leave the roof as it is. The gutters were cleaned and unblocked. Nothing needs to be addressed at this point and another roof inspection will be conducted at a future date.

#### TREASURER'S APRIL REPORT:

**Moved:** David Irving **2**<sup>nd</sup>: Chris Holst

**INWARD CORRESPONDENCE:** Correspondence was received from various MOCA State Representatives and the Nations Committee via Tony Kilvington and a few Qld club members in relation to the notice Ed had placed in the magazine. No one wanted to see the club fold and almost all correspondence received was positive. The suggestions raised by Qld club members to try and lift participation will be addressed at next month's meeting as this meeting was to just deal with the main issues at hand. Ed advised further discussion on those main issues was to be held over until we get to General Business.

**OUTWARD CORRESPONDENCE:** Ed's responded to those emails that were inward bound to advice those senders their emails were received.

MEMBERSHIP DRAW: Neil de San Miguel

**MAGAZINE:** Ed confirmed Robyn would resign as magazine editor as of June. Stuart Brown will take on the role as of June.

Ed advised he had held discussion with other clubs and 7 of the current advertisers.

- 1. Most clubs publish their magazines either bi-monthly or quarterly
- 2. It has been decided to move to a quarterly magazine
- 3. Of the 7 advertisers who replied all were happy with a quarterly magazine and agreed to the same rate for their advertising with the following updated. Robyn advised she was no longer enjoying compiling the magazine and that she had been doing it since 2011. Ed spoke about the cost of printing 100 copies of the magazine and most advertisers were happy to receive an electronic copy.

Brett Elliott offered free printing which was accepted by the Committee and members.

Ed spoke about the Event Calendar to clarify the intention of it, so there are no misunderstandings.

- 4. The event on 3 May 2020 has the incorrect date.

- 4. Dinner at pub on Friday night We make our own arrangements in terms of selection of meals and paying for them Ed to try and secure back room like last time.
- 5. Anna's Restaurant Saturday night need firm numbers to secure booking Advise Monique Callander Social Director.

Discussions had with Tony Kilvington SA Treasurer, and they have implemented the following – Ed suggested we will discuss further in future meetings but maybe we need to give this consideration

- 2. If name drawn and not present draw will jackpot
- 3. There are 350 members state-wide
- 4. South Aust gets 60 70 members on each run and are limiting numbers on runs as they are unable to locate venues to accommodate them.

Monique spoke about Stanthorpe:

- 1. RSVP required ASAP for numbers at Anna's on Saturday night
- 2. It's a \$55 set menu
- 3. Discussion about theme Christmas in June or Italian night.
- 4. Italian night was decided upon

# MEMBERS PRESENT AT THE MEETING WHO ARE CELEBRATING BIRTHDAYS THIS MONTH WERE GIVEN A FREE TICKET IN TONIGHTS RAFFLE:

**QHMC:** Ed opened the discussion on SIVS. John Green has sent in his report and Ed will put it in the magazine for everyone to read.

- 1. A considerable number of new members obtain a SIVS Letter and are never seen or heard from again. Not a good scenario as those people maybe using the cars as everyday drivers??
- 2. Gordon has lost track of the number of letters done, but it may be as high as around 150 200 since being dating officer. He is compiling data for the management committee to review when he gets the chance.
- 3. Database of members does not match with the SIVS letter produced
- 4. There is no follow up either by MOCA or TMR once letter is lodged with TMR
- 5. Club to do something proactive and constructive and shouldn't allow this to continue.
- 6. Steps need to be put in place to enable "some" control
- 7. Ed proposed that no SIVS letter get issued for first 12 months of membership
- 8. People may participate when they see they will lose something and it's the right thing to do.
- 9. Open discussion then occurred about SIVS Legislation and usage everyone had a fair chance for expressing their input etc.
- 10. Open discussion about 70km radius to attend meeting and exemptions that can be applied at the discretion of the Management Committee when approving memberships. The aim is to improve participation and getting the balance right.
- 11. Within SEQ there may be approximately 60 100 members who do not participate in any club activities.

  Understanding those in the northern and western Qld regions have clear reasons for limited participation those members are not to be impacted by these new by laws.
- 12. Unknown at this stage just how many members are on SIVS without looking at the register, but a fair assumption is potentially 33% based on a count of hands at this meeting of 34 attendees.
- 13. Some new members join, just to get SIVS and then never maintain membership of MOCA nor participate.
- 14. Article to be placed in the magazine about SIVS and insurance implications
- 15. Open discussion about Insurance implications if using vehicle outside of SIVS

David Irving suggested that Shannon's first editorial in the Magazine should be about the Insurance implications should vehicle be involved in a crash whilst being operated outside the boundaries of the SIVS requirements. All at the meeting agreed. Ed to talk to Phil Ross from Shannon's and see if they can compile a editorial on SIVS vs Issues around insurance.

# A Motion was put forward: 'Committee to present a plan for the proposed restructure of the SIVS process and the manner in which it will be monitored by MOCA'

**Moved:** David Irving **2**<sup>nd</sup>: Rick Dunford

- 1. To be voted on next meeting
- 2. Wording of the SIVS letter
- 3. Clearly outlining the conditions
- 4. Identifying the risk 3<sup>rd</sup> party Insurance
- 5. Member to sign the letter acknowledging the requirement
- 1. Gordon has lost track of the number of letters done but it is around 200

Dave Irving attempted to move a further motion regarding the proposal of the implementing the 3 meeting and 3 runs (3 and 3) format to improve member involvement.

Ed advised the meeting of the following just for clarity.

- 1. The club's constitution allows the Management Committee to introduce new By-Laws that are already silent under clause 15 & 18. This was the basis of pushing forward for quick action to resolve the current situation.
- 2. Ed as President and meeting chairperson advised he would prefer not to accept the motion presented, but would prefer to simply put it forward to a vote tonight rather than drag the issues on by hold this all over until the next meeting and therefore making it in a sense another 2 months to resolve the issues. It was decided to accept that decision so the issues can be put to bed without dragging it on.
- 3. A vote was held with the 34 members present
- 4. Overwhelming majority agreed to the following
  - 0. Implementation of 3 and 3 and to be included on membership from as of 28 April 2020
  - 1. 12-month embargo on new members obtaining SIVS documentation

## **NATIONAL DELEGATES:**

Alan Messenger reported the following with interjections from others

- 1. National Concours Committee have decided Adelaide 2023 will be held at Easter.
- 2. Future events from 2024 will move away from Easter due to costs etc
- 3. NSW and Vic clubs are going well
- 4. WA is booming as they have a member who is a caterer and caters for all their runs.
- 5. Discussion was had about the Club constitution / Qld Incorporations act it states clearly if ever the club was to fold, it must divest all funds to likeminded clubs in Qld, not to members.
- 6. Some discussion took place if this were to happen, whether it could be given to the National Club with the stipulation that it be returned to Qld to re-establish MOCA Qld. The Qld constitution and Qld Incorporations Act would also prevent this from taking place. Nonetheless, the discussion was shut down as that will not be taking place.
- 7. Vic Newland voiced given what is taking place with a drive to lift club participation etc it should not be discussed about folding the Club and dispersing club funds as there are members here that have been in the club for over 40 + years.
- 8. All members agreed with Vic Newland and further agreed we should strive forward to secure the clubs future.
- 9. Strategies were discussed on attracting new members with newer cars
- 10. There will be a new class in Adelaide Nationals for Restomods
- 11. Adelaide Nationals to also cater for newer model cars as well.
- 12. Qld will move to possibly October / November 2024 but still to be decided on suitability of the logistics etc.
- 13. Victoria have advised they will adjust their dates to work around ours
- 14. Qld to hold State concours prior to April 2023

#### Stan Gallo spoke about the Shelby register

- 1. The National Shelby register has not been maintained
- 2. All Shelby owners are encouraged to contact Stan to have their details included on the register
- 3. The register is available for all Shelby vehicles not just Mustangs
- 4. An article about the Shelby Register will be placed in the Magazine in upcoming issues

It was very heartening to hear that everyone wants the club to strive forward and not fold up.

Thankfully we now have a new Secretary, current member David Lewis has kindly stepped forward to take on the Secretary position and man David was certainly thrown in the deep end on his first night at the meeting on 27<sup>th</sup> April.

I look forward to working with David and the rest of the management committee to see these changes implemented and to race toward having a lot of fun activities unfold.

# New club By-Laws proposed and voted in at the last meeting are as follows:

For those members residing within a 70km radius of the clubhouse at Morningside - Members residing outside this 70km zone are NOT affected by these By Laws simply due to the logistics.

1. There is now a requirement for members living within the 70km radius to attend a minimum of Three (3) club house meetings per year and Three (3) club run events.

The management committee can apply dispensation to any member who has a legitimate reason for not being able to attend as set out above. However, the bottom line guys is this is really aimed at trying to lift the member participation albeit it might seem like a big stick approach it was agreed that it is also not that onerous on members to meet this requirement. We really need to lift participation levels, otherwise there is no point having the club.

There will now be NO SIVS registration club letters issued to new memberships during the first 12 month joining period (this can be looked upon as a waiting / probation period) - Far too many new members are not continuing their membership once club registration has been issued. It is a Department of Transport MOCA - Qld requirement for members to maintain their club membership in order to be granted with SIVS.

These By-Laws were voted in by large majority of those members attending the April general club meeting.

Anyone who may wish to discuss this can talk to myself if you have any concerns.

Now it's time to get out and have fun in our Mustangs - we have a lot of activities planned as shown in our event calender -





# Historic 1965 Ford Mustang Shelby GT350R

# Sold for record \$4 million



A one-of-a kind 1965 Ford Mustang Shelby GT350R was sold at the Mecum Auctions Kissimmee, Florida, event for \$4,070,000.



It was the highest price ever paid for a Mustang and \$220,000 more than what the same car auctioned for in 2020.

The car, serial number 5R002, was built as a prototype for the GT350R competition model, of which 34 were later built. It was tested by Ken Miles of "Ford v Ferrari" fame, who also raced it along with famed drivers Bob Bondurant, Peter Brock, Jerry Titus and Chuck Cantwell.



The GT350R was designed with a modified version of the Mustang's 289 cubic-inch V8 that puts out over 350 hp, an oversized 34-gallon racing fuel tank, and various suspension and drivetrain updates.

The now fully restored car went on to win 10 races in the SCCA Production-B class before being sold in 1966 to a Ford engineer for \$4,000, who later installed an experimental Ford GT40 racing V8 that was included in the sale.

The Shelby has now been twice sold for more than the second-most valuable Mustang, which is the 1968 GT 390 from the Steve McQueen film "Bullitt" that was sold at the 2020 edition of Mecum's Kissimmee event for \$3.74 million. (Source fox news)




