So, that's about it for now, enjoy this issue and send in your Mustang Stories as soon as you can for the next one.



ELIGIBILITY

The Mustang Round Up and Victorian State Concours is open only to Ford Mustangs, including Shelby, Boss, Californian Special etc. and any other version of the Mustang Body fitted with a Ford engine.

All vehicles must be registered at the time of entry and be entered in the owner's Family Name. Club registration is permitted; trade plates or temporary permits are not permitted. All vehicles must be able to pass a roadworthy/ defect certificate check.

The Entrant must have owned the vehicle and been a financial member of M.O.C.A of Victoria for at least 60 days prior to the event to be eligible for any trophies.

Entrants must decide before entering, which class they want to compete in. Once the vehicle has been entered it cannot be placed in another class except at the discretion of the Head Judge, who may change the class entered vehicle to the appropriate class. The Entrant will be notified of any class

Note: The 3 x club event attendance for Concours classes eligibility has been waived for this year due to COVID-19 pandemic impacts to on attending club sanctioned events.

Concours Showroom Original & Modified Classes

- Entry form & payment to be received by the M.O.C.A. Vic Secretary no later than 5pm Friday 23rd September 2022.
- Entry Eligibility is based on, and governed by, a rolling 10 year process. A Vehicle with a manufactured date of less than 10 years is not eligible to enter this class at any time.
- Vehicle can be transported to the event but must be driven into the Display and Judging areas.

Concours Driven Original & Modified Classes

- Entry form & payment to be received by the M.O.C.A. Vic Secretary no later than 5pm 23rd September 2022.
- Entry Eligibility is based on, and governed by, a rolling 10 year process. A Vehicle with a manufactured date of less than 10 years is not eligible to enter this class at any time.

Show 'n' Shine Class

- No previous club event attendance required.
- Entry is open to any member/vehicle which has not been awarded the Most Outstanding Mustang Show 'n' Shine Class or either a State or National Concours class trophy within the last 5 years.
- Entry form & payment can be prepaid by 5pm 23rd September 2022 or by 10am on the day.

2022 MUSTANG ROUND UP & STATE CONCOURS Judging Information

CLASSES

All Concours Driven & Show 'n' Shine class entered vehicles for judging must be registered and driven into the venue. Concours Showroom class vehicles can be trailered to the venue and must be driven into the display & judging area.

All Vehicles will be judged on how they are presented on the day. When examining any aspect of the vehicle, points will be lost for collision damage, rust, grease, dirt, overspray, staining, poor general appearance or lack of preparation.

Cost of entry into the judged classes:

- Concours Driven & Showroom Concours class \$65.00 per vehicle.
- Show 'n' Shine class \$25.00 pre-entry or \$30.00 on the day.

All judged entries must be presented to the judges clear of all items other than those required to be included in the judging of the vehicle. For example if no Ford part No. or documentation available covering said items remove item/s! (Chairs, umbrella's etc.)

Concours Driven & Showroom Original Class

Open to Mustangs which are of original manufacture as per the Vin Plate or Door Tag/Decal. All parts and accessories to be original or genuine Ford (USA) approved, otherwise points deducted. Reproduction parts may lose points at judge's discretion. Please note Showroom Class vehicles will judged to a higher standard i.e. no Road grime, stone chips etc.

Concours Driven & Showroom Modified Class

Open to any year model modified Mustang powered by a Ford engine. This class allows owners to modify the car to suit their personal tastes.

A basic list of modifications must be made out and submitted by the entrant prior to judging, will be attached, section by section (i.e. interior, under body, engine bay etc.) to their judging score sheet before judging. Internal components are not judged. Please note: Showroom Class vehicles will judged to a higher standard i.e. no Road grime, stone chips etc.

Show 'n' Shine Class

1964 $\frac{1}{2}$ - current Model, Originality and Modifications are a consideration in this class but the only "Condition and Presentation" of what is in place at time of judging shall be taken in to account. There is no under car Judging (no need to go up on ramps) within this Class.

No judging sheets will be returned to the owners for Show 'n' Shine Class judged vehicles.

AWARDS

Gold, Silver & Bronze Concours trophies are awarded for those vehicles which have achieved the eligible point levels within Driven & Showroom Original and Modified class judging. The highest Original class points scorer will also receive the Kevin Musgrave Award for Concours Excellence. These awards are presented at the Annual Presentation Dinner on Sunday 23rd October.

Show 'n' Shine class trophies will be awarded on the day and are dependent on the number of entries received by the cutoff date. There will be 1 x trophy awarded to the Most Outstanding Mustang which will be elevated to Concours class judging.

45th Historic Winton

The running of the 45th Historic Winton took place over the weekend of 28 and 29 May 2022, celebrating the 100th anniversary of the Austin 7 motor car.

The day began quite cold with the outside temperature hitting a very chilly 3 degrees at one point on the drive to the circuit.

However the frost and fog cleared to a beautiful day with sunshine breaking through the clouds on occasions throughout the day.

Crowd numbers were down from pre-Covid events with only about two third the number of vehicles on display and a lower number of competitors in the pit area as well.

I travelled to Winton with a good friend who came to support a mutual friend racing his beautiful replica 1938 SS Jaguar 100 in the Regularity event. He had recently installed a supercharger to the car.

In the Saturday Regularity, he had an "off" sliding into the fence and amongst other minor damage, bending a pitman arm. So, living in country Victoria, he trailered the car home, repaired the pitman arm and returned to Winton in readiness for the Sunday event.

Unfortunately, when readying the car on Sunday morning he discovered a leaking head gasket putting the car out of action again. As they say - "That's racing".

Racing amongst the various classes was, as always, very competitive with drivers giving their all, irrespective of whether they were at at the pointy end of the field or somewhere further back.

The meeting celebrated the centenary of the Austin 7 car and naturally there were many Austin 7's in their various styles proudly showing off in the Grand Parade as well as veteran, vintage and classic vehicles, including a couple of old Clipper busses, classic ambulances and a few truck thrown in for good measure. All up, the entire course was covered in vehicles.

We ran into fellow club members De and Neil who had also driven up from Melbourne on the day, wandering through the displays, working out how to enlarge their garage space to make room for all the cars which took their fancy.

Probably less than a dozen Mustangs on display but an interesting display field none-the-less. If cars of the pre 50's or 60's are of interest, this is a great event to attend.



Adolescent and Young Adult (AYA) has been a great focus at Monash Children's Cancer Centre, and one of Taylah's passions as she was diagnosed as an AYA, at ages 14 and 19. There is evidence to suggest that the options of clinical trials and different types of cancer therapy may improve the currently poorer outcomes in AYA cancer patients compared to young. Hence why The Biggest Playdate money will be going towards an AYA clinical trials coordinator, who will help merge children's and adult oncology to broaden treatment options and improve outcomes for AYAs.




Get to know your fellow Mustanger

CAR CARE Tools, Techniques & Tips

Episode 15 - Deep Cleaning Rims
Peter Alderson

You're probably quite confident with washing, cleaning and protecting your entire car, both inside and out. But, there's one area that can do with a little extra attention, and it is often overlooked. So, in this episode, I'll be explaining how to "Deep Clean Rims".

We all clean our rims when we wash our car, right? Well, we do at least clean the outside areas of the rim, and maybe those areas inside the rim that we can reach with our hands or special brushes. However, due to the intense heat, dirt, brake dust, and contamination that our rims experience, they deserve at least one deep clean every year. Now is that time!

My car is 5 years old and is our daily driver, so the rims get quite dirty. I've broken down the cleaning and rejuvenation with protection into two stages. So, follow along as I explain how I 'Deep Clean' its rims.

The Tools - Rim Cleaning

Here are the tools you are likely to use.



The tools for rim deep cleaning.

The Tools - Deep clean and rejuvenate rims.

- 1. 1 x pair of gloves to protect hands.
- 2. 1x Bowden's Auto Body Gel.
- 3. 1x Bowden's Three Way cleanser.
- 4. 1x Claying Pad, Claying Cloth or Clay Bar.
- 5. 1x Can Goof Off for wheel weight glue removal.
- 6. 1x Bowden's Cleanse & Restore OR Metal Polish.
- 7. Some general-purpose microfibre cloths.
- 8. One flagged brush to wash tyres.
- 9. Some Bowden's Big Blue Softies.
- 10. A stool to sit on during all processes. Get comfy!

Additional Equipment - Wheel Removal

At home, you will need this equipment.

- 1. Jack to hoist car for wheel removal.
- 2. Wheel chocks to stabilize car.
- 3. Car stands to stabilize car.
- 4. Wheel brace / breaker bar for stud removal.
- 5. Torque wrench to tighten studs correctly.

TIP: Always work in a safe manner so you are not injured, and your car stays still. Work in a dust-free, cool environment. Do find somewhere that will keep you, and your car, protected.

Deep cleaning your rims can be broken down into two stages:

Stage 1: Washing and decontamination.

Stage 2: Application of protection.

Preparation for Deep Cleaning Rims

In preparation for deep cleaning we need to wash the rims. Primarily, this is to remove embedded iron from the surface that has come from our brakes.

TIP: Think about this: The rims are exposed to extremes of heat, dust, dirt and general grime. This results in rims that can be badly embedded with materials that make a deep clean harder if not totally removed.

In previous episodes I have explained how to rid paintwork of these materials using Bowden's Three Way. This effectively removes the embedded contamination coming from brakes and other baked on contaminants. We will do the same here—whether your rims are painted, or chrome, or made from any other metal. Follow the instructions on the bottle if you forget how to use Three Way.

1. Rim Decontamination

You might think you can effectively decontaminate a rim while it is still on the car. Think again!

You might be able to clean the outside of the rim, and maybe some of the interior – if you can actually reach that far.
Unfortunately, there will be parts of the rim interior you are unable to really deep clean easily.

So, to effectively decontaminate and protect each rim we will need to remove each wheel as part of our entire deep clean process. We will wash it thoroughly and decontaminate as we go.

So, remove the rim

TIP: Safety is Essential. Do take care to chock all wheels, use a safety stand, and a strong jack. Remove any handles from the jack or move the handle to a vertical or upright position to avoid tripping on it. Place wheel brace, breaker bar, torque wrench, and studs together and nearby, so nothing is tripped on or lost.

Be Careful!

Rim removal

You need to carefully remove one rim at a time to perform the two stages of deep cleaning. Once each rim has been completed, and remounted, you can work on the next until all rims have been finished.

- 1. Park car on level ground.
- 2. Choose a dry, dust free space out of the sun.
- Choose a wheel to begin.
- 4. Chock opposite wheel and rear wheels.
- 5. Use a breaker bar / wheel brace to loosen studs.
- 6. Hoist car slowly and carefully.
- 7. Insert a car stand as a safety measure.
- 8. Remove all studs.
- Remove wheel.
- 10. Place wheel on a flat surface outside where it will be washed, decontaminated and protected.
- 11. Perform Stage 1 then Stage 2 on that rim.
- 12. Return rim to the car, and tension studs appropriately, before moving to the next rim.
- 13. Repeat until all rims have been completed.

You are now ready to commence Stage 1 cleaning.

The Techniques: Rim Cleaning Stage 1: Washing and Decontamination

First off, grab your normal washing equipment, and wash the rim. Use a car wash product that does NOT contain any wax, or sealants, as does Bowden's Nanolicious. That's NOT appropriate in this step, as we want to eliminate all products from the rim. Adding it during a wash would be a waste, as we will shortly be removing all products in following steps.

In this case I use Bowden's Auto Body Gel. This is a very effective cleaner that will not add wax, protectants or sealants. It just gives an effective cleaning to what you are washing.

Once you have washed and dried your rim all over -including the tyre - it is time to decontaminate.

Removal of embedded contaminants is achieved with Bowden's Three Way. It can be used safely on all metal surfaces and rubber. So the entire wheel, and rim, will be decontaminated.

Spray Three Way on the outside of the rim and tyre. Allow it to dwell for a minute or so, and you will see a purple reaction occurring with the solution. This is a chemical reaction where the iron from brakes is activated, and lifted from the surface.

Now, grab a Bowden's Claying Cloth, Claying Bar or Claying Rubber Pad to work the Three Way around. This assists in lifting all embedded iron deposits and creates a smooth finish to the rim that will aid the application of protection a little later.

As far as the tyre is concerned, use a wheel brush to agitate the Three Way over the rubber to help lift away contamination. A soft toothbrush can be used in tighter areas such as lettering and the groove where the tyre attaches to the rim.



Brush tyre, covered in Three Way, to deep clean.

Once you have worked your way around the rim, and tyre, spray it off with a strong flow of water.

Repeat this process on the inside of the rim and tyre - Three Way with Claying Rubber. After completing this step give the whole tyre and rim another wash* with Auto Body Gel, rinse and dry.



After Three Way and final wash, spray strongly.



CAR CARE Tools, Techniques & Tips

Episode 15 - Deep Cleaning Rims

TIP: *Three Way is extremely viscous. It tends to stick to surfaces – even after being washed away. Not to worry. Once all surfaces have had the Three Way treatment we wash the whole tyre and rim again with Auto Body Gel. This will remove any residual traces of Three Way. Rinse well.

Removing Wheel Weight Glue

On some of my rims I discovered there was left over wheel weight glue that my tyre fitter did not remove. Not to worry, this is not a hard job, but it can be time consuming.

You will need to use a glue remover and a normal microfibre cloth to work over the area. Eventually you will have it all removed, and the area underneath left free from glue.

TIP: Goof Off is a corrosive liquid. It can damage your skin, so be sure to wear a pair of gloves that will do the job of protecting your skin.



Goof Off is Acetone. You might also know this as Nail Polish Remover. The can I use was bought from Bunnings and comes either as a spray or squirt on liquid. Do take CARE, as it is a harmful chemical. You MUST Wear Latex Free Gloves.




Goof Off. Use to remove the Wheel Weight Glue.

Here is how to eliminate wheel weight glue:

- 1. Spray Goof Off onto the area in need of cleaning.
- 2. Allow it to dwell for 30 seconds.
- 3. Spray some Goof Off onto a microfibre cloth.
- 4. Gently use a gloved finger to work the cloth on a section of the glue at a time.
- 5. Spray area, and cloth, and continue to rub away.

Here you can see the gradual removal of the wheel weight glue from the rim. Keep spraying and work steadily from one end to the other. Mine took about 10 minutes to remove completely. That glue is tuff!

Now, with the interior of the rim decontaminated, and any wheel weight glue removed, it's time to give a final inspection.

Run your hand around the interior. If you feel any gritty areas that seem to have a sharp raised surface then that is likely to be dried tar or embedded contaminants. Goof Off, or Bowden's Ta Ta Tar, will be used with a microfibre cloth to dampen the area and gently rub to remove these spots. Eventually you will have an interior surface that is completely clean and free from contamination.

Preparing the surface for protection

The final step in preparation for protection is smoothing the surface and removing any residual product from previous treatments. Wax and sealants may NOT be removed with what we have already done. So, in this last step we use Bowden's Cleanse and Restore to remove any previously applied wax, protectants and sealants. If your rims are ceramic coated then use Flash Prep instead.

Paint Cleanse and Restore

Now, Paint Cleanse and Restore is NOT a polish. It will not remove a layer of paint in order to restore shine. Rather, it will perform the same type of deep cleaning as is done by Flash Prep. However, it is also going to bring back the lustre of your paintwork as if it was new. If your paintwork is dull, then this is the product to use and NOT Flash Prep, as that product is not designed to restore lustre to tired paintwork. Paint Cleanse and Restore removes the same array of waxes, etc., as well as oxidation, dull spots, minor imperfections and gives a smooth finish ready for wax, and final protection, to be reapplied.



Use Paint Cleanse and Restore before protection.

Here is how to use Paint Cleanse and Restore:

- Work on your rim in the shade and away from sunlight and dusty wind.
- 2. Select a quarter of the rim, then spread Paint Cleanse and Restore onto your applicator pad. Spread this around the pad with your finger to give an even coverage.
- Work in straight lines along the rim, then work back in straight lines across – so North/South then East / West. This ensures all areas have been cleaned. You will see a light haze.
- 4. Grab your dry Big Blue Softie and, with its short pile side, immediately remove the hazing Cleanse and Restore. Rub in straight lines.
- 5. Now, get another dry Big Blue Softie and perform a final buff with the long pile side.
- 6. As Paint Cleanse and Restore is a thick product there may be some areas where the haze was not completely removed with the first pass.
- 7. Remove this with the short pile side of your first cloth. If it still does not move, then gently wipe over the area with your still damp applicator pad. This re-moistens the surface enabling it to be easily removed with the short pile side of your Big Blue Softie.
- 8. When successfully removed, perform a final buff with the long pile side of your second cloth.
- 9. Move to the next section of your rim and repeat steps 2 to 5 until all of one side of the rim is done.
- 10. Turn your rim over and repeat this process on the other side inside or outside of the rim. DONE!

You are now ready to add protection . . .

The Techniques: Rim Protection

Stage 2: Application of protection

It's time to apply protection to the rims and tyres.

We want the rims to shine and have great anti-static properties to help prevent them from accumulating brake contaminants and general dust. As a bonus here, I'll explain how to minimize any light scratches on the rims before we apply the sealant coatings.

The Tools - Rim Protection

Here are the tools you are likely to use.



The Tools for rim protection.

The Tools - Rim rejuvenation and protection.

- 1. Gloves to protect your hands.
- 2. Restore Colour add Color Magic Wax to restore colour and add shine to painted rims.
- 3. Hide Scratches add a Glaze to fill scratches, level the surface and add amazing shine.
- 4. Add Protection (1) Fully Slick adds an anti-static layer to help repel contaminants.
- 5. Add Protection (2) After Glow adds shine and a top coating sealant.
- 6. Add Tyre Sheen as a final dressing step to the INSIDE and later, the OUTSIDE of the tyre.
- 7. Applicator pads for applying protection products.
- 8. Big Blue Softies and Drop Bear microfibres to remove products and perform a final buffing.

The Technique - Restore colour

Rims are subject to potential damage from dirt, brake dust, and chipping or scratching. Also, the inside of your rim may not have been painted as well as the exterior. Colour may be patchy and thin. This can be corrected with Turtle Wax Color Magic. It minimizes scratches by adding tinted colour dye embedded within the wax. It comes in many colours, but I guess most rims will be black. If you have chrome or grey use your favourite chrome wax or jump to the next step: How to Hide Scratches.

Use a damp foam, or microfibre applicator pad, to apply Turtle Wax Color Magic. I use Black. The embedded colour dye within the wax deposits into scratches and blends them into the colour of the rim. Work your way around the inside of the rim using a small circular action to embed this coloured carnauba wax into any small scratches. When a haze appears buff away with the long pile side of a Big Blue Softie.

Turn your rim over and repeat on the outside of the rim. Ensure all haze is removed before turning the rim back over to the inside for the next step.

CAR CARE Tools, Techniques & Tips

Episode 15 - Deep Cleaning Rims

The Technique - How to hide scratches

I have recently started using a glaze and I have found it fabulous. Its ability to add an intense shine, and to eliminate fine scratches, is amazing.

Whatever colour, or metal your rims are made from, it will give them added character and a simply brilliant, glowing shine.



I use Mothers California Gold Micro-Polishing Glaze Step 2. It contains a super-fine polish that further improves the paint surface by leveling it to minimize scratches. At the same time, it fills and hides minor swirls and defects, hiding unsightly imperfections. Micro-Polishing Glaze is key to giving both light, and dark colours, the perfect finish. You can also use it to enhance your car's paintwork. But do NOT use it on a Ceramic Coat.

Use a foam, or microfibre, applicator pad, to apply Mothers California Gold Glaze. Spread evenly over one portion of the area being treated. Use a circular motion, gently massaging the glaze into the surface. It will dry to a haze in about 30 seconds.

Buff off gently with the long pile side of a Big Blue Softie or a Drop Bear microfibre cloth until the surface is clear of the wax. A second coat can add extra wax protection and helps to hide scratches even more, although I have found this not to be absolutely necessary. As my rims were in a reasonable condition anyway, I only applied one coat of Glaze. Continue to the next portion of your rim and repeat the application and removal process.

Once the inside has had the Glaze treatment check to see that there is no residual haze that may have developed. If so, simply buff it away. Once you are happy, turn your rim over and perform the Glaze treatment on the outside painted areas of the rim. Ensure all haze is removed before turning the rim back over to the inside for the next step.

The Technique - Add Protection (1) Fully Slick

Bowden's Fully Slick will add a really smooth finish to the surface of the paint. It has the added benefit of applying a layer of UV protection. This means your paint will be less likely to fade.

Start by spraying Fully Slick onto the short pile side of a Big Blue Softie, and use that to spread it over the interior of the rim. Do NOT spray it onto the surface otherwise you will end up using too much product. In the next image I am spraying it onto the non-plush, or short pile side, of a Big Softie.



Apply Fully Slick using a Big Blue Softie.

Working in straight lines, spread Fully Slick over the area. As soon as you have applied Fully Slick remove it by buffing with a Drop Bear microfibre. Do not allow Fully Slick to dry, as this will make removal harder. I prefer to use a Drop Bear due to its deeper pile and greater absorbency that comes from its higher polyamide percentage. The deeper pile helps buff into the many crevices you may come across on a rim – on both the inside and outside.

The UV protection of Fully Slick increases with further coats. If you were protecting your rims for the first time in a while then I would recommend using up to 3 coats. Remember to wait 1 hour between coats of Fully Slick to give each the necessary time to cure. If you rush, you will be removing the previous layer rather than adding to it! It will not have had enough time to cure and harden. With great paintwork one coat is sufficient. Either way, wait an hour before applying the final layer of protection – After Glow.

Turn your rim over and repeat on the outside painted areas of your rim. Once treated, turn the rim back over to the inside for the next step.

The Technique - Add Protection (2) After Glow

Bowden's After Glow will add a protective sealant on top of the wax and Fully Slick. After Glow adds a shine, gloss and strong antistatic protection, that seals the surface and enhances hydrophobicity.

Use a dampened Big Blue Softie. Spray your cloth with about 6 to 8 sprays of After Glow.

Now, gently wipe your cloth around all areas of the interior of your rim. This leaves a slight mist on the surface. Once applied, a light haze will appear after about 30 seconds. Buff the haze away with a Drop Bear microfibre. Don't leave it on too long otherwise it can be more difficult to remove.

If you notice smears on the rim then buff again, or it means the cloth is not totally dry. Time to use another Drop Bear that is completely dry.

Turn your rim over and repeat on the outside of the rim. Ensure all haze is removed before turning the rim back over to the inside for the next step.

If your rims have not had this treatment for a about three

months its worth applying a second coat of After Glow. Once you've applied, and buffed away the first coat, wait 15 minutes for it to cure then apply and buff away this second coat for a maximum seal and anti-static protection. Repeat on the outside of the rim. These two coats will protect the underlying protective layers for up to three months. As After Glow is a synthetic product it provides longer protection to the other organic wax layers applied.

The Technique - Adding Tyre Sheen

Time to add a final dressing to the INSIDE then OUTSIDE of the tyre itself.

We want the tyres to compliment your beautifully clean and shiny rims. My approach is to have the tyre look like it has just come from the assembly line. The walls, and the tread, have a consistent, clean and dry sheen - on the inside and outside. This is our chance to add tyre sheen to the INSIDE of the tyre - facing in towards the engine not just the outside.



Inside of tyre should be treated with protection.

Tyres can become grey, dry and prone to cracking if left untreated. I spied a car in a car yard and saw the inside of the tyre – grey, dry and lacking UV protection. Tyres need their lost oils replaced, and UV protection applied, to prevent breakdown.

Applying Tyre Sheen

We'll apply some Bowden's Tyre Sheen, or your chosen product. Bowden's is easy to apply with an applicator as it goes on freely and dries very quickly. It replenishes the rubber with enriching oils to protect and preserve, adds UV protection to stop cracking, and lasts a long time over many washes. It's water resistant properties help keep the tyres cleaner for longer. It removes browning on all tyres that have not been properly cared for, and will not harm any finishes - chrome, metal, paint, or white walls.

Apply Tyre Sheen

Use an applicator or a Bowden's Muffy sponge. Spray 3 to 4 squirts onto your applicator then run this around the inside wall of the tyre. It will go on very easily. The Muffy has a high pile so will allow the Tyre Sheen to be deposited into the fine, and deeper, grooves on your tyre. It may look wet but it dries quickly to a sheen finish. Re-spray sponge if needed.



Applying Tyre Sheen.

If the inside of your tyres have not had this treatment, or it was over three months ago, it's worth applying a second coat of Tyre Sheen. I would wait about 5 minutes for the first coat to soak in, and dry to a dull sheen, then apply the second coat for maximum protection.

You might be tempted to turn your tyre over and repeat on the outside of the tyre. But take care! Doing so could mark the inside of the tyre as it is laid down on the ground. I prefer to wait until the tyre has been remounted onto the car before I apply the Tyre Sheen to the OUTSIDE of the tyre. That way the inside stays clean and I am less likely to mar the surface of the tyre by my handling of it during the remounting stage.

So, once the tyre is remounted, repeat the Tyre Sheen application process on the OUTSIDE of the tyre. This application of Tyre Sheen will protect the tyre for up to three months

If you accidentally spread some of the Tyre Sheen onto your rim you can use a damp, normal microfibre cloth to just wipe it away - very gently.

Now, it's time to repeat the cleaning and protection processes to all remaining rims! Job Done!

Episode 15 - Deep Cleaning Rims



The Tips - Deep Cleaning Rims

- Park car where it can be jacked up for rim removal and where it can remain safe.
- 2. Remove first rim and wash both it, and the tyre, with Bowden's Auto Body Wash then dry it.
- 3. Use Bowden's Three Way with a Claying Rubber to remove embedded contaminants from the rim and use a brush on the tyre
- 4. Rinse carefully, and thoroughly, with a strong flow of water.
- 5. Wash rim and tyre again with Auto Body Wash.
- 6. Rinse and dry the rim and tyre.
- 7. Use Goof Off to remove any weight glue.
- Use Bowden's Cleanse and Restore to deep clean, remove protectants and oxidation, and smooth the painted surface of the rim.
- 9. Use Color Magic Wax to restore colour.
- 10. Use Mothers California Gold Glaze to hide scratches and smooth the painted surface.
- 11. Apply Bowden's Fully Slick to add a smooth anti-static layer of protection.
- 12. Apply Bowden's After Glow for a shine and sealant to underlying wax.
- 13. Apply Bowden's Tyre Sheen and remount rim.








In memory of Kevin & Josie Musgrave Boss Auto Parts & Mustang World


It was also a cover car for Mustang Monthly magazine in December 2014. I still own the car today.

The Australian Shelby Registry was created back in 2009 by the Australian Mustang Club and affiliated with Shelby American (SAAC) Australian

Shelby Owners and Mustang Motorsport. Nez Demaj was elected the Australian Shelby Registrar by the Australian Mustang Club and certified by SAAC in 2009.

The main objective of the Australian Shelby Registry is to create a data base of early and late model Shelbys and establish the amount and wherabouts of all Shelbys in Australia. Also, to have links with SAAC and to update their records, change of ownership and any relevant information of each Shelby produced.


