

Dear members

Readers will recall that the MUSTANG **ROUND UP &** STATE **CONCOURS** was scheduled for Sunday the 23rd at Caribbean Park

but unfortunately cancelled due to the foul weather forecast.

Despite the wet weather on Saturday 22nd about 50 Shelbys turned up at Mustang Motorsport.

As the cars were all on bitumen and there was plenty of sheltered space for Shelby owners in the workshop and display area the wet weather was not a problem.

At Caribbean Park the cars would have been displayed on grass and it was decided by MOCA, AOMC and the

management of Caribbean Gardens, quite rightly, that it would not be practical to go ahead with the display.

I was a little disappointed that I did not see any 60's era Shelbys. However, given that probably all of the Shelbys on display had at some stage been through Craig's careful

> hands at Mustang Motorsports it was not surprising that they were all late models on display.

> All the Shelbys were in great condition, but one car in particular took my eye and that was a current model Shelby painted in what

before personalised number plates it was just 3 Alphas and 3 numerals ABC 123 or in more recent times 1AM 2BR. But then the option to identify your wheels with some fun or a desire to see your name in (tail) lights.

There have been some classics such as 4MYEGO on a Roller and 6ULDV8 carried by a braggart in NSW before somebody realised and had it withdrawn.

A certain footballer allegedly had FIGJAM to tell the world just how good was. These days it can be obvious, such as BIGKEV, MAGIC1, LOADED etc.

However it is occasionally a given name where letters are replaced by numerals because the plate is already in use. B14NCA for BIANCA. 3LV1S for ELVIS.

The conditions to display vehicles were quite stringent and although they had room for 40 cars only 18 owners took up


on site for the 3 days or driven in

I made good time, time enough to top up with fuel at a cheap servo and pick up a coffee at a Scottish drive through.

When I arrived I was the 4th car in the display area and the others rolled in shortly after. Cars parked, owners introduced to each other and admired minor changes some had done. A couple of polishing clothes came out and were used.

First activity was for all the participants to gather at one of the garages on Pit Lane where the order of procedure was explained.

Grab bags of goodies were handed out along with nice new umbrellas as a souvenir. We were to gather near the track around 10:30am. 10 cars were rolled out on to the track and passengers lined up.



As your turn came a car pulled up, you buckled yourself in to the passenger seat and away you went. My driver was a young fellow who lived near me and we talked about the Macedon Ranges rather than the car.

A pretty standard Mustang, speed limited to 130kmh for this activity, one lap and that was it. I must admit I've driven around Sandown in my own car faster than that but it was interesting observing his technique and style.

Later in the morning a signing session was organised at the back of the pits with half a dozen drivers fitted with pens autographing some posters. They all seemed so young but I guess that is part of my growing older. I grabbed a couple of posters and had them signed as a gift for a young enthusiast who lives near me.

On the Friday the G.A. tickets basically allow you to all areas excluding Pit Lane. I wandered the Paddock area where the Porsches were being prepared then accessed the Grandstand to watch the Aussie racing cars (funny little things that go like the clappers), Porsches, Toyota 86s and others before the Supercars got a run.

By 2:00pm I had had enough. I had to get up early then missed out on my nana-nap and the activity on the track was boring. Practice but no racing so I sidled off to the Blue Flash and headed home.

CAR CARE Tools, Techniques & Tips Episode 16 - Wheel Arch Rejuvenation Peter Alderson

Wheel arches are another area that we might rinse and scrub somewhat whenever we wash our cars. However, we cannot guarantee that we are actually cleaning everywhere in this difficult area.

Over time, they deserve a little extra attention to ensure they stay undamaged and in good order; are actually clean; the colour is restored; and, they will not be subject to fading, drying out or at worst, cracking due to becoming dried out. So, in this episode, I'll be explaining how to "Clean and Rejuvenate Wheel Arches".

We all clean our wheel arches when we wash our cars, right? Well, we might spray some water in there to knock away obvious layers of mud. But do you go the extra mile and scrub the arches as well? Given the punishing these areas get from water, road film, dust and mud, tar, stones and gravel, our wheel arches deserve one deep clean at least every year. Now is that time!

Last episode we removed our wheels to perform a really deep clean of the rims. Now, while our rims are off, it is a convenient time to clean and rejuvenate our arches. So, let's do that now.

The Tools - Wheel Arches

Here are the tools you are likely to use to deep clean and rejuvenate wheel arches.



The Tools for wheel arch cleaning & rejuvenation.

The Tools - Wheel arch cleaning & rejuvenation.

- 1. 1x pair of gloves to protect hands.
- 2. 1x Bowden's Auto Body Gel WET Wash.
- 3. 1x Simple Green WET wash.
- 4. 1x Bowden's Clean Detail DRY wash.
- 5. Wash sponge / microfibre cloths.
- 6. 1x Flagged Brush / paint brush for agitation.
- 7. 1 x Bowden's Ta Ta Tar or Goof Off.
- 8. 1x Bowden's Mr. Black The Black Box set.
- 9. 1x Bowden's Vinyl Revival.
- 10. Applicator pads foam or microfibre.

When rejuvenating wheel arches, break the process down into three stages:

Stage 1: A WET wash outside.

Stage 2: A DRY wash inside with enhanced cleaning.

Stage 3: Rejuvenating surface and adding protection.

The Techniques:

Stage 1: A WET wash.

Wheel arch cleaning begins outside with a WET wash. When washing the car is a good time to do this. I do my wheels first and then move to the body.

TIP: Washing your wheels and arches first, gives them time to dry whilst you wash the exterior of the car. That way when you move the car inside to perform the deep clean everything will be dry.

Here I will concentrate on the wheel arch alone, so follow these steps to give them a thorough cleaning.

- Set yourself up with a stool; hose with adjustable wash head; washing bucket; and, rinsing bucket. In the bucket is Bowden's Auto Body Gel. It has a balanced PH, is highsudsing to carry away dirt and will NOT add any wax or protection. Remember, we are performing a deep clean and will be stripping away any previously applied products. Using a wash that adds wax or protection would be a waste here.
- To loosen dirt, and other contaminants, use your hose to give the wheel arch a good soaking. This helps loosen dirt, mud and brake dust. For the wheel arch, use a flat / vertical setting on high pressure. No painted surfaces here to protect so we can push contaminants away and soften them ready for step 3.



Wash wheel arch with a high pressure, flat spray.

- 3. Next, grab your long-handle brush to scrub the wheel arch. Remember to use the suds and rinse the brush after each scrubbing before getting more suds. Brushing helps loosen any material that was not wash away with the initial flush of water. Go around the arch, and back and forth across it, to get all areas clean. Don't rinse just yet, just let the suds soak.
- After the suds have soaked for about 30 seconds, use your hose to spray away the suds, and grime. Be thorough and go back and forth a number of times.



Scrub wheel arch, let dwell, then spray clean.

5. You have a choice: Spray Bowden's Orange Agent, or Simple Green* (strong solution) around the arch. Spray generously around all areas of the arch you can reach with your cleaning spray bottle. Let it dwell for 30 seconds to penetrate and loosen any contaminants. Use the long-handled brush to scrub areas you can reach to disperse residual grime.

Interestingly, you can do this on arches that have the felted cloth noise reduction as well as the arches that are covered with the normal black plastic covers.

*TIP: I tend to use Simple Green, It is cheaper than Bowden's, I can dilute it to a stronger solution for this type of dirty job, and I can use it in greater quantities without worrying about the cost.

- 6. When you have finished your final scrubbing, give one final rinse with the hose use the flat / vertical setting on high pressure. Work from the top of the arch and rinse downwards, pushing the water from top to bottom. Do this a number of times until you see clear water running from the arch onto the ground. This will ensure no cleaning product is caught in the arch.
- Grab your leaf blower and blow dry the arch working from top to bottom. Once finished, you can wash the rest of your car. This allows time for the wheel arches to dry before the next stage.

Preparing for a DRY wash.

Move your car into a safe area where you can remove the rims, one at a time, to get access to each wheel arch. I use my underground garage. You need to have some space around your car where you can safely place the tools you will use, a seat to make working more comfortable, and, good lighting.

You must remember that scrubbing the arch during washing has not entirely cleaned all parts of the arch. The brush you used can only reach so far. Behind the wheel especially can be hard to reach and is often not cleaned as well as more easily accessed areas. So, there will be parts of the arch you were unable to really clean easily.

To effectively deep clean and protect each arch we will need to remove each wheel as part of our rejuvenation process. A dry wash is needed.

So, remove the rim



As was stressed in my previous article, you must work safely to ensure both you, and your car, do not come to grief.

TIP: Safety is Essential. Do take care to chock all wheels, use a safety stand, and a strong jack. Remove any handles from the jack or move the handle to a vertical or upright position to avoid tripping on it. Place wheel brace, breaker bar, torque wrench, and studs together and nearby, so nothing is tripped on or lost.

Episode 16 - Wheel Arch Rejuvenation

Rim Removal

Carefully remove one rim at a time to perform the next two stages of deep cleaning, then rejuvenation. After each arch is completed, and the wheel is remounted, work on the next until all rims are done.


- 1. Park car on level ground.
- 2. Choose a dry, dust free space out of the sun.
- 3. Choose a wheel to begin.
- 4. Chock opposite wheel and rear wheels.
- 5. Use a breaker bar / wheel brace to loosen studs.
- 6. Hoist car slowly and carefully.
- 7. Insert a car stand as a safety measure.
- 8. Remove all studs.
- 9. Remove wheel and set aside.
- 10. Perform Stage 2 a DRY wash on the arch.
- 11. Perform Stage 3 rejuvenation on that arch.
- 12. Return wheel to the car, and tension studs appropriately, before moving to the next arch.
- 13. Repeat until all arches have been completed.

You are now ready to commence Stage 2 cleaning.


Stage 2: A DRY wash with enhanced cleaning.

When performing a WET wash the wheel gets in the way! This means there will be areas of the arch that have not been cleaned thoroughly. Not to worry – this is why we do a DRY wash once the car is inside, the car has been jacked and the rim removed.

Inspect the arch. Look for areas where the dirtier spots are, as these will be the main focus of your DRY wash procedure.

 If parts of the wheel arch are only lightly dirty after its wet wash you can use Clean Detail. It's a cleaner that evaporates quickly, leaving a totally clean, and dry area.



Spray Bowden's Clean Detail on to any dirty areas of the wheel arch to moisten and loosen grime.

Then, with a brush, or microfibre cloth, agitate the area to lift away light deposits of oil, grease, and dust from the surface being cleaned.

The Clean Detail then evaporates away, leaving no residue. Perfect for a DRY wash procedure.

You may have noticed that I am NOT going to use Bowden's Orange Agent, or Simple Green, or Bowden's Sublime Clean around the arch. All of these

cleaners are great, but require washing off.

I want to make life easier with no messy water getting onto the floor. After all, they also require more drying, and I do not want to be worried about water and drying when working inside my garage.

TIP: Bowden's Clean Detail cleans then evaporates away, meaning no washing is needed. The result is a cleaner and speedier process.

2. As you work your microfibre around the arch you may notice some areas are gritty and your cloth catches on them. This is going to be small areas of dirt or tar that were not removed with washing alone. Time for Bowden's Ta Ta Tar or Goof Off.

Both of these products will help you remove these 'sticking points' and make the plastic smooth again.



Spray the area with your chosen product, and spray your microfibre cloth as well. Gently scrub the area to remove the 'sticking point' and then wipe over with some Clean Detail. Buff with a DRY microfibre.

You are now ready to commence Stage 3.

Stage 3: Rejuvenate surface and add protection.

These final steps are relatively quick. First we will rejuvenate the plastic. It may be looking grey due to oils being lost and the effects of UV making the black plastic look much lighter. Rejuvenation is also needed to stop untreated plastic from cracking.

The first thing to do is use Bowden's Flash Prep to ensure our plastic is extremely clean prior to its application. For Bowden's Mr. Black to work correctly, the plastic must be free from any oil, dirt and silicones, or any previously applied product, such as those we have used during the cleaning process, as well as any previously applied Vinyl Revival.

So, get your bottle of Flash Prep and two general-purpose microfibre cloths – one for application and the other for drying.

1. Work on a section at a time, say the front half of the arch, spray Flash Prep onto the surface and some on to your microfibre cloth. Work the product around all areas of your chosen section being careful to spread it into any depressions and crevices. Once you have spread it around the area you will notice it starts to evaporate. So before it totally disappears, grab a clean microfibre cloth and wipe over the area. Be sure to dry off all Flash Prep before moving to the next section of the arch you want to clean.

Time for Mr. Black to work his magic!

2. Grab Bowden's Mr. Black bottle of solution and the applicator pad. Mr. Black uses very concentrated, and extremely fluid, dark dyes and is formulated for all black external plastics of your car, including the black plastic grill. The little bottle of Mr. Black is only 250ml, but as it is so easily applied it will do many cars. Use it sparingly as applying too much to your applicator pad is just going to waste it. It goes a LONG way!

TIP: Bowden's Mr. Black is a Black dye, plastic trim restorer. It is used either on any black plastic that is in need of a colour restoration, giving aged and greying plastic a renewed black appearance. WEAR GLOVES to keep hands safe from the dye.



Just a few drops of Mr. Black are all you need.

3. No tricks here. With a few drops on the applicator pad you will be able to easily spread the dye around all areas of the plastic arch. Go over previously applied areas in a different direction to ensure all areas have been completely covered. As a guide, when treating your entire wheel arch you only have to load the applicator about 3 times, each time, with 3 or 4 drops on the applicator pad.



Apply Mr. Black. North/South then East/West.

4. Allow Mr. Black to soak into the arch for a few minutes. Grab the second applicator that comes with the Mr. Black pack, and gently wipe over the area you have completed. This will even out any darker or lighter areas you have may noticed. No need to apply any solution during this leveling process. You are just ensuring an even spread of Mr. Black.

 Allow the Mr. Black to soak in to the arch for about 10 minutes. Give a wipe over with a normal microfibre cloth to lift away any un-dried Mr. Black.

I chose to purchase the Mr. Black Box (\$85) rather than just the bottle of Mr. Black (\$55). The Box comes with multiple applicators, and a special applicator brush, for applying Mr. Black to smaller, or tricky areas. Gloves, cloth, and Flash Prep are also in the box. Great value I thought, so why not invest?

- 6. The final stage now apply Bowden's Vinyl Revival. We've used Vinyl Revival before on all external black plastic, rubber trim, vinyl tops and the like.
 - Being pH neutral it can be used safely on all of these materials, gives UV protection, and a mid-sheen appearance. It is also water resistant so helps keep the wheel arch plastic looking good for longer.
- 7. Apply it using a general-purpose microfibre, pad or a brush for hard to reach places or crevices.

Spray an applicator tool and wipe over the entire wheel arch. Allow to dwell, and soak into the plastic, for a few minutes. Then use a dry microfibre cloth to remove any excess product.



After it dries you will have a plastic wheel arch that looks perfectly dark, with a mid-sheen, well-protected, and new-looking surface. This lasts up to 12 months. Now, it's time to repeat the cleaning and rejuvenation to all remaining plastic arches! Job Done!

The Techniques: Wheel Arch Rejuvenation

The stages in rejuvenating your wheel arches:

- Wash, and brush, arches as part of a normal car wash with Auto Body Gel, then Simple Green.
- 2. Move car to a dry place to remove wheel to get access to the wheel arch. Safely remove rim.
- 3. Dry wash arch with Bowden's Clean Detail.
- 4. Remove embedded tar Ta Ta Tar or Goof Off.
- 5. Wipe over with Clean Detail to remove product.
- 6. Wipe over with Flash Prep for a final clean.
- 7. Restore colour with Mr. Black.
- 8. Restore protection with Vinyl Revival.
- 9. Remount wheel, tighten nuts, and buff rim.
- 10. Repeat on your next wheel arch.

Best GLASS cleaning - EVER!!!

Glass cleaning is a bugbear for most people. It seems no matter what you use to clean the glass - windscreen interior especially - it always looks misty and streaky. And before long, it is all misty again!

Well, in this BONUS I will share with you my glass-cleaning secret. Now, I have previously explained in detail how to clean glass. That episode was especially relevant for glass that needed a complete rejuvenation. You can read it in Episode 4, Winter Edition 2019 of Mustang Roundup.

In this BONUS however, I will focus on how to maintain the cleanest glass you have ever seen, with little effort and long-lasting results!

My approach to glass cleaning has recently undergone a significant change. Whereas I once used a dedicated glass cleaner, such as Bowden's Glass Cleaner, I now use a completely different product – with much greater success.

My go to product now is Bowden's Flash Prep. What? I hear you cry! Well, let me explain why it is THE product to use for cleaning glass.



Flash Prep is a product that is used for ridding paintwork of all previously applied products such as sealers, wax and fillers. So, Bowden's After Glow, Fully Slick, Boss Gloss, Lazy Wax and even Mothers California Gold Glaze are all safely, and easily removed using Flash Prep. This then leaves the surface completely clean and ready for the reapplication of such products.

What is so good about Flash Prep? It's the formula and how it works that makes it the best glass cleaner.

Flash Prep contains a number of types of alcohol. These give it the ability to moisten and dissolve away silicones, polishing oils, fillers, finger print oils, cigarette smoke residue, grease, waxes, and sealants.

This makes it perfect to clean away many of the contaminants likely to be found on glass – especially the inside of a windscreen. It leaves the surface clean and with an anti-static quality meaning it will attract less dust.

Unlike traditional glass cleaners that tend to dwell and stay wet on glass, Flash Prep goes on wet, dwells but then will evaporate. This means there is less likelihood of any residual product attracting dust or drying to leave dirty marks or streaks

Now, the second part of this process involves the application and removal products used to clean the glass as well as the physical process when cleaning.

The Tools - Glass Cleaning

Here are the tools you will use to perfectly clean your glass - especially the interior of the windscreen.

The Tools - Glass Cleaning.

- 1. 1 x Bowden's Flash Prep.
- 2. 2 x Repco 'Eclipse' Glass Cleaner applicator pads.
- 3. 2 x General-purpose microfibre cloths.
- 1 x Glass polishing cloth.

The Techniques:

 I start by wrapping one of the Eclipse Glass Cleaner applicator pads with a general-purpose microfibre. You could also use the short pile side of a Big Blue Softie if you prefer. Use the short pile side in the application process. It absorbs less product than the longer pile side, so your product lasts longer.

2. Spray about 6 squirts of Flash Prep on to the cloth. That will be enough to wipe over about one quarter of the windscreen. Wipe over the chosen area going back and forth - that is easier to do on the inside of the windscreen than going up and down. Be careful to go around the outside getting the pad into the edges as far as possible.

TIP: NEVER spray Flash Prep on to the glass directly, or any other glass cleaner for that matter. You risk overspray dripping on to the dash and other areas. That just means more cleanup!

3. Grab your second applicator pad and wrap it in your second microfibre cloth, or the long pile side of a Big Blue Softie. I tend to use the normal microfibre cloth, as it is easier to get right into the edges, where the glass meets the dash, compared to the thicker Big Blue Softie. You need to work reasonably quickly as we know Flash Prep will start to evaporate. Again, wipe back and forth and not up and down to soak up the Flash Prep, along with the contamination from the glass.

TIP: Do NOT let any cleaning product DRY before it is removed. That just means any contamination dries back onto the surface you are trying to clean! The only time you let a product DRY is a protection product – wax, sealant, glaze, etc.

Continue to clean the remainder of the windscreen.
 Remember to use the wet microfibre cloth for initial cleaning with Flash Prep, then swap to the dry microfibre cloth, and pad, for the removal process.

As you progress around the internal glass your applicator cloth, and pad, will become moist. That is not a problem.

But, that is why we use the second applicator pad and cloth to remove Flash Prep. We do NOT want to be swapping cloths on the same applicator pad otherwise we are likely to be putting a dry removal cloth onto a wet pad - not good - as you will be just spreading more moist Flash Prep around

 Once you have cleaned the entire glass area it is time to give a final buff or polish to the glass. This will ensure any spots you may have missed are cleaned properly and there will no streaks.

Use your glass polishing cloth, wrapped around a dry applicator pad, to perform a final wipe over of the glass. Do not press hard otherwise you may find the pad starts to scrunch up and this can lead to areas not being polished correctly.

Now, if you have done this correctly, using the products I recommend, you will have a windscreen will be absolutely clean and streak free. And, I have found that this cleaning process will leave your glass cleaner for longer.

There will be NO streaks as the applicator pad evenly distributes the pressure from your hand equally over the entire surface of the pad. Compare this with just using your hand holding a cloth. Your fingers apply pressure and between your fingers there is NO pressure. This leaves room for streaks to occur – and we have all had that problem. So the applicator pad is one key ingredient here in achieving absolutely clean, streak-free glass.

The second ingredient is the use of Flash Prep to effectively clean and dissolve away all plastic fume residues, smoke haze, and other contaminants, from the interior glass surfaces. Its ability to evaporate away means there will be no areas left wet that, once dried, will leave contamination deposits on the glass as occurs with other glass cleaning products that do not evaporate away.

The Australian Shelby Registry was created back in 2009 by the Australian Mustang Club and affiliated with Shelby American (SAAC) Australian

Shelby Owners and Mustang Motorsport. Nez Demaj was elected the Australian Shelby Registrar by the Australian Mustang Club and certified by SAAC in 2009.

The main objective of the Australian Shelby Registry is to create a data base of early and late model Shelbys and establish the amount and wherabouts of all Shelbys in Australia. Also, to have links with SAAC and to update their records, change of ownership and any relevant information of each Shelby produced.

Once a Shelby owner has submitted their details such as their name, state of residence and Shelby details such as VIN and Shelby numbers then their information is loaded in the Australian Shelby Registry. Once submitted, the Shelby owners details are kept confidential at all times and never published in any magazines or websites. In each state of Australia, there are State Shelby Representatives who can assist any present Shelby owners with any questions relating to their Shelbys.

There are advantages in being an Australian Shelby Registry member as there are many Mustang and Shelby displays organised around the country so every Shelby member is contacted via email whenever there is an upcoming Shelby display. Also, when a Shelby owner decides to sell his/her Shelby, they can inform the Australian Shelby Registrar and he will email all Shelby Registry members.

The Australian Shelby Registry is a group of Shelby owners who come together at various Shelby displays around the country while enjoying each others company and their vehicles.





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
